## PIRT I - BRIEF SUMULRY

1. This report covers the Nevel phases of the Amphibious Operations in connection with tho mounting, movenent, and londing of SIXTH hrmy troops assiened to occupation of the S'iSEBO-NLG/SLKI, and FUKUOKiSHIMONOSEKI lreas of JiPIN, following the tormination of hostilities. The period covered begins with 1 Se terber 1945, the cate of doperture of Comandor SOUTHERN Occupation Grcup and Comianding General FIFTH Gophibious Corns fron the HiNMII.N iren, and concludes with the dete of the dissolution of the SOUTYERIV Occupation Grcup on 8 November. The oporetions involvod wero undertcken in cormlionce with CTF 54, Commendor FIFIH Lrmhibious Force, dispetch criors of 17 hv ust 1945, which assignoc: Corrandor Arphibicus Group FOUR tho task of plonning and conducting the nevel phases of tho landines in tho S.SSBC-NLG.S.II and FUKUOKiSHI:OMOSEKI hroes.
2. Trsk Group 54.1, SOUTHPRN Occupation Grow, undor comend of Rear Ldrircl Roifsnidor, Comonior Lrehi'ious Group Four, was orennizod for the operation in accordence with CMF 54, Comancer FIFTH irphibicus Force, Oporation Plon $11501-45$. The FIFTH Lmohibious Corps, comandod by ITajor Genoral Schridt, USNC, consistod of VLC He adquerters, Corps Trac ond the FIFTH llorine Divisin, tho SECOID Merine Division and the 32nd Infentry Division, U. S. Irry. Those trcops wero rountec in the HaWinIII MAIIMiS and PHIIIPI IIE Lress rospectively, and moved pros ressively as separato groups to the S.S..BO-N.G.S.KI irea in accordence with moverent ordors issucd by Cormendor SOUTHERN Occunation Group.
3. CTF 54 Oporation Plon insi nated SLSSBO as the first port to be occupied, on 22 Septorber 1945, by the FIFTH inphibious Corns Headquartor Corps Troons, and tho FIFTI licrino Divisjocn. The lencing at S.SSEBO was follo"ed by the ocoupation of NLC.SSIKI on 23 Septerber by tho SECOND Marine Division. Tho plon dosi notec the FUKUOK-SHIMONOSEKI larec. as the ultinato destination for the 32nd Infentry Division, which was Ionded at S.SEBO beginning 14 Octcbor and revod overlend to the objective. This last lending completod tho ovorsea :overent of troops outlinod in this roncrt. No Jepaneso opposition wes enccuntered during any of the above landings, which were occomplishoc without sericus difficulty, other than celoys incidont to clocrine harbors ond cpprocches of mines, utilizing port facilities whore available. Fire support ships and air support units were prosent and on coll to support the lending operations at SiSEBO and NLG.LSEKI but at no tino wore these forces c.ctivoly ene ged. Followine the landing of the 32nd Infentry Division at ShSESO the SOUTHER1 Oceupetion Grcup was dissolved on 8 Noverber.

1. Immediately after the arrival of transports in the transport area on ..BLE Day (?? September) the LCVPs, LCM and varve guides were launched in preparation for the troop landings on GPEEN Beaches at 0930 .
2. The ICTs arrived at the target on 26 September, having sailed under their own power from OKI"AWA, with full load.
3. The harbor at SASEBO is well protected and weather conditions permitted uninterrupted launching and loading of all other landing craft on 22 September.
4. The dock area (see ..Tea How Dock Leg, Enclosure (A)) is not particularly suited to the use of landing craft. Howover, four largo soaplone ramps arc located at the Seaplane Base and aircraft factory (see is eas Sugar and Victor, Enclosure (a)). These areas are ideally suited to the beaching and unloading of all typos of landing croft.
5. The first phase of the operation included the landing of troops and supplies over these ramps. It was carried out expeditiously and with a minimum of confusion. This area continued to be used for the unloading of supplies from all types of landing craft and proved to be highly satisfactory.
(c) Control.

On ABLE Day ( 22 September) control vessels were stationed off the Dock Areas in the inner harbor as vol as off the GREEN Benches, On 23 September, the control vessel off the Dock: Areas was secured, and control functions then were performed by TransRon 22 Control Officer from an $\operatorname{ICS}(\mathrm{L})$ in the Supply Basin.

(3) Minesrreeping, Undervator Demolition.
(a) Minesweoping was performed by TG 52.3 SASEBO Sweep Group, as directed by CTF 55. Requests for minestreeping from Commander SO THERN Occunation Group wero directed to ComF IFTHPhibFor who in turn forwardod these request to CTF 55. In addition, CTG 52.3 furnished information by dispatch relativo to arcas swopt.

The SASEBO Sreop Group conducted minestreoping operations in the SL.SEBC Krea in accordance with Commender Mine Craft, Pacific Operation Order 15-45. A channol 4000 yards wide was strept, beginning at $32^{\circ} 30^{\prime} \mathrm{N}$ and $129^{\circ} 30^{\prime} \mathrm{E}$, and oxtending to SASEBQ Harbor. The area surrounding the entrance to SKSEBO KO, and the area between GOTO RETTO and the islonds immedintely off the shoreline of western KYUSHU were also sweyt.
(b) Undervater Demolition Teams assigned to the SOUTFERN Occupation. Group were specifically diroctod not to use any explosives in the performance of their duties, without permission first being obtained from higher authority. No demolition work was required during the operation. The Undervater Domolition Toems assisted the Group Beachmaster by post-occupation roconnaissences. Further soundings were taken in various arens and nev lending craft slots discovered. Pre.. and post occupation roconnaissanco reports wore complete and reli:ble.
(L) Landing Troops and Cargo.
(a) General unloading of troops and cargo at S.SEBO commenced on 22 September. Troops of the 27 th RCT landed at the seeplane ramps at GREEN Boach. The remaining troons of the FIFTH Marine Division and the FIFTH Amphibious Corps were landed at the docks at Sa'SEBO, both from shins' bonts and directly onto the docks from ships alongside. General unloading of cargo begen immediately after the troops were debarked. Three ships at a time were able to dock in Area. EiSY. Tho ogress ro:d hero boing too narrow, cargo \#7as unloaded into ships' boats, with some later assistance from LSMs, and landed at various plnces along the veter front, Seven ships were able to dock in the Repair Basin, and unloaded directly onto the docks using ships' booms. Three shins at a time were able to dock in the dry docks, and unloaded diroctly onto the docks using both ships' booms and dock cranes.

Initially, one IST at a time was ablo to unlood in the Boat Besin; later tro unloading spots wero available. Nine unloading spots were available at the seaplane ramps at the Lir Station and three at the Aircraft Factory. ISMs were unloaded both at the ramps and at the Boat Basin. LCTs used only the ramps. These seaplane ramps provided excellent unloading-spots.

Unlocding sterted slowly the first doy due to the nem conditions. All hands quickly adoptod themselves, however, and the unlonding thenceforrord procoodod smoothly and expeditiously. Unlosding, except for resupply, vos finished on 28 Sontember.
(b) Unlooding of both troops and enrgo from APAs and AKAs at NAGASAKI roas done diroctly over docks. LSTs and LSMs unlooded directly onto the beech.

Fewer docks and unloading places were available at NMGASAKI than at SASEBO. Unloading time was the same, homever, due to the smaller amount of troops and cargo to be londed. Unloading commenced on 23 Soptombor and was completed on 28 Soptember.
(c) Unloading of the 32nd Infontry Division, scheduled for 14 October, 1945, will be coverod in the action report of ComTransRon 22.

(n) Provisions were made initiolly for tho care of casunltios in the event of opposod lnndings and during lnndings without opposition. Subsequent developments during the planning phose and during the period enroute to the occupation aroas disclosed that the only casualties to be expected were those due to illness and accidental injury. THOMAS JEFFERSON ( 1 PA-30) had boon fittod and equippod to provide hospital care for cesullios during the inital occupetion. With the expected incidence of cosunlties due to illnoss and accidental injury the orgenizetion of individunl ships and units offerod adequate medicel facilitios for medical care of noval per* sonnel and personnel of the l-nding forces, without ovecuntion to rear bases. The lnding forcos provideत hospital facilities ashore for the forces ashore within three to five deys of the Inndings which further roduced the amount of modical cero to be nrovided by naval activities. i. 60-dey evacuation policy was established for the forces ashore. Petients of the landing forces on shins were transforred to hospitol facilities ashore, as approprinte. Shios and naval units provided the medical care for their own norsonnel.
(b) The incidence of cosualtios among personnel was well within the number of those normilly to be expected.

This was done in rotation, four or fjve ships at a time, at berths alongside vessel.s of TrnnsRon 12, then loeding at tho piers, and at the one small tankor then available, anchored in the channol. Funling was comploted in timo to mect the schoduled sailine hour.
4. No sorious difficulty yas oxnorionced in the dolivery of provisions and othor supplies. Thnt extensive requirements and tjeh schodules wero met was due to the vigorous cooperation of the locnl commands.
