## Aetion Report

16 August 1945 to 2 Soptember 1945

PART I - BRLEF SUDEARY.
A. INDIANA in Taak Group THIRTY- BIGHT POINT ONE patrolled off the east coast of HOMSHU, Japan, avaiting the formal surrender of the Japanese Empire. This report covers the period 16 August 1945 to 2 September 1945, during which no enemy action occurred. Shipis own aireraft were not flown.

B. Operations of this Task Group consisted of patrolling off the coast of HONSHU, Japan, and air patrols over Japan, locating and dropping supplies to Prisoner of War Camps.

Training during this period consisted of A.A. practioe fired at towed sleeves on 16,17 , August, and 1 September, and at TDD drones on 18 August 1945.
C. IMDIANA's mission was to give anti-airaraft and surface support to Task Group 38.2.
D. Task Group 38.1 , with the other Tesk Groups of Taik Toroe 38, were dispersed around the Japanese home islands for a show of force, awaiting Japan's formal surrender.

A. Ant1-alreraft gunnery exercises.

All A.A. Piring was conducted in secordanee with Commandor Battieship Squadron TVO's Conflaential Letter TCl-2/ p11(1)/A5-1, Serial 0332 of 7 July 1945. Excellent treining was received. Due to the ebsence of several key men, training was necessarily concentrated on rollef gunners and control personnel. Results were uniformy goou.

D. 1. ComBat Information Center.
a. (1) On 27 Auzust 1945, Latitude $37-43 \mathrm{Ns}$, Longitude $144-57 \mathrm{E}$. At 1045 a Japanese surfeced submarine was sighted by the H HOOCK OAP $255 / 19$ miles fron Task Croup 38.1. The submarine was flying a black surrender flag. The destroyers DASMISL (DD659) and MCRRAY (DD576) were desfenated to intercept.

(2) Kmployment and Porformanee of Redar.

The following guards vere asslened the ITDIANA: SK radar for medium range ain search $30-75 \mathrm{mlles}$; SP radar for low flying elroraft search. The SG-1 wes eme ployed for station keeping, and $\mathrm{SC}-2$ for ail around surface search. The performance of all radars duxing this period was very good.

Unusuad intereeptions were as follows: on 25 August 1245, Latitude 38-35 No, Longitude $343-36 \mathrm{E}$. At 2208 a contact 103/16 miles froil the formation wes notioed on the SP's and SK's of the rormation. Indioations wore weak and fluctuating, movement was at first radical, then on a atoady course, speed about 30 knots.

1 September 2945, Latitude 38-07 N1., Long itude 144-04 R. At 0015 the above phenomena was again noticed 132/11 miles from the formation, on a southeriy course with a speed varying from 20 to 40 knota . The final evaluation by the Task Croup CIC officer was that the contacts were bira flooks or possibly largo 12 sh.

The following navigational applioations wore employed: on 29 August 1945, the 1000 foot range of mountains on MOJTMA SAKI peninsula wes pleked up on the SK redar at 93 niles. On 1 September 1945 , JUJI YMMA $(12,388$ feet hi.gh) was pioked up on the SK rader 250 miles,

The SP radar gave very satisfactory results on approaches, and while operating noar land as followst on 1 September 1945 , at 2215 , IIUBO SAKI POIIT ( 253 foet hlgh) was pleked up at 65 miles and tracked while the Task Group moved down the coast.

While operating southeast of NOJDM SAKI, the following points were constantly used for radar ranses and bearingst 0 SHIMA ( 2477 feet hich), MIXAKS SHMM ( 2674 feet high), MIKURA sHMMA ( 2802 feet high), and other prominent peaks in the area as interoepted and identifled. The above mountain peaks wese tracked up to ranges of 75 miles with conslatant good radar fizes on the SP radar.
