The U.S.S. Houston in company with the H.M.A.S. Perth engaged a Japanese force of undetermined strength late in the evening on February 28, 1942 in Sunda Straits, N.E.I. and was sunk at approximately 0030 on March 1, 1942. Survivors landed at various points on the coast of Java, were taken prisoners by the Japanese and concentrated at Pandeglang prison, Rangkasbetoeng prison, Serang prison, and in an improvised prison in Bantam Park theatre in Serang. (Details appended in personal statements).

On April 5, 1942, Lieut. R. R. Ross, U.S.N. accompanied by 25 men arrived at Bicycle Camp, Batavia where a large number of allied prisoners were concentrated (S.O.P.-Lieut.Col., Ross Thompson A.I.F.). On April 13, 1942, Lieut.(jg) H.S. Hamlin, U.S.N. arrived at Bicycle Camp from Serang prison in company with approximately 150 officers and men (See appended muster list). On this same date Col. A.C. Searle, U.S.A. arrived, accompanied by two enlisted men of the U.S.Army. Also Brigadier A.S. Blackburn, V.C., A.I.F. and a large number of allied prisoners arrived. On April 15, 1942 approximately 150 enlisted men arrived at Bicycle Camp from Rangkasbetoeng and the "Theatre" prison in Serang (See appended muster list).

The organization was as follows; C. in C. Brigadier Blackburn, Camp Commandant Col. Searle. The American detachment consisting of 11 commissioned officers U.S.N., 1 commissioned officer U.S.M.C., 3 Warrant officers U.S.N., 340 enlisted men U.S.N., 2 enlisted men U.S.A., and Flight Sgt. John Morgan R.A.F. (An American citizen transferred to this command) was commanded by Lieut. R.R. Ross U.S.N.

April 25: The Commanding officer held mast in the case of C.N. Burgard Seaman 1/c, U.S.N. charged with profanity, insubordination, and insolence to a petty officer and assigned punishment as follows: 10 days confinement in the Camp Brig; punishment remitted to 14 days probation and restriction to the barracks compound.

April 27: Felix, I.A. Yeol/c, was transferred to "Dutch Military Hospital" in Batavia.

April 28: C.N. Burgard Seal/c, U.S.N. was confined in the camp brig to serve 10 days by order of the commanding officer for breaking his restriction to the barracks compound.

May 2: Wilkinson, E.T. Seal/c, U.S.N. was transferred to "Dutch Military

Hospital" in Batavia.

May 3: The commanding officer held mast and assigned punishments as follows: Corp. J.H. Faulk U.S.M.C. insolence to a petty officer-assigned 5 days restriction to barracks compound; Pvt. C.H. Williams U.S.M.C. insolence to a petty officer - assigned 5 days restriction to barracks compound.

May 4: Wilkinson, E.T. Seal/c, U.S.N. was returned to this camp from "Dutch Military Hospital".

May 5: At about 2100 this date, Lieut. Russell R. Ross U.S. Navy died in the camp hospital (See appended statement by Lieut. (jg) C.D. Burroughs, (MC) U.S.Navy). Lieut.(jg) Harold S. Hamlin U.S. Navy assumed command of the U.S. Naval Detachment in this camp.

May 6: With permission of the Japanese Authorities funeral services were held for Lieut. R.R. Ross U.S. Navy. Allied forces in this camp were paraded as the body was removed from the camp and the American officers accompanied the body to the cemetery. Brigadier Blackburn represented the Australian forces in the funeral procession and the service at the cemetery was performed by Chaplain F. Kellow A.I.F. The body was interred in plot 48, British section, Petamboeran Cemetery Batavia, N.E.I.

May 8: By order of the commanding officer, C.N. Burgard Seal/c, U.S.N. was released from confinement.

May 14: The Second Battalion, 131st. Field Artillery U. S. Army less Battery "E"; Lieut.Col. B.S. Tharp U.S.A. commanding, arrived at this camp as prisoners of war. C.L. Thomas Seal/c U.S.N. who arrived with the "Artillery", was transferred to this command. Sgt.W.W. Rockett and PFC.B.O. Shores, U.S.A. were transferred from this command to the "Artillery".

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May 21: Agin, G.L., Sea2/c, U.S.N. was transferred to "Dutch Military Hospital" in Batavia.

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May 29: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Back, C.A., SF3/c, U.S.N. charged with insubordination and assigned punishment as follows: 5 days confinement in the camp brig. Before confinement began, Back attempted to escape from this camp and was apprehended by the Japanese guards. He was confined in the camp brig by the Japanese authorities. Back was further assigned a trial by Summary Court Martial for "Breaking Arrest".

May 30: Memorial Day Ceremonies were held by the American Forces in this camp. (See appended description by Col. A.C. Searle, U.S.A.)

June 2: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Glover, R.M., Seal/c, U.S.N. charged with insolence to a petty officer and awarded punishment as follows: 3 hours extra duty.

June 3: The 5 days confinement awarded Back, C.A., SF3/c, U.S.N. at mast on May 29th, expired and Back was further confined as a court martial prisoner awaiting trial by order of the commanding officer.

June 5: The Summary Court Martial of which Lieut.(jg) L.W. Rogers, U.S. Navy is snior member met at 1410 in the case of Back, C.A., SF3/c, U.S.N. and adjourned at 1525.

June 6: Published finding and sentence in the case of Back, C.A., SF3/c, U.S.N. tried by Summary Court Martial on June 5, 1942 for "Breaking Arrest". Finding: Guilty. Sentence: To be confined for a period of 45 days and to lose pay in the amount of \$30.00 per month for a period of 4 months; total loss of pay amounting to \$120.00. Finding and sentence approved by the convening authority but sentence remitted as follows: Period of confinement reduced to 25 days. Loss of pay reduced to \$15.00 per month for a period of 4 months; total loss of pay amounting to \$60.00.

At 1000 this date, Back, C.A., SF3/c, U.S.N. began serving a period of 25 days confinement awarded by Summary Court Martial.

June 9: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Marinos, M.M., Seal/c,

U.S.N. charged with "Leaving camp on a working party without permission", and awarded punishment as follows: 2 hours extra duty.

June 11: Lindsley, A. J., Sea2/c, was transferred to Dutch Military Hospital.

June 14: All men of this detachment signed the following oath for the Japanese authorities under duress:

"Whilst Prisoner of War 1. To keep strictly to the orders of the Japanese Commandant. 2. Except where contrary to the oath of allegiance to the United States and its Constitution which I have taken, I will obey absolutely the Japanese Army and will not resist it. 3. Absolutely not to go outside the enclosure except with the permission of the Camp Commandant. The above I swear - Signed......."

June 17: Stanczack J., MM2/c, was transferred to the Dutch Military Hospital in Batavia.

June 18: Back C. A., SF3/c, serving confinement in the camp brig as sentenced by Summary Court Martial was unaccountably released by the Japanese authorities with no explanation. The commanding officer extended the limits of confinement for Back to the limits of Bicycle Camp for the duration of his assigned confinement.

June 26: Agin G. L., Sea2/c, returned to this camp from Dutch Military Hospital.

July 1: By order of the commanding officer, Back C. A., SF3/c, was released from confinement having served 25 days as sentenced by Summary Court Martial.

July 4: All Prisoners of War in this camp were forced to sign an oath for the Japanese as follows: "The undersigned has solemnly sworn henceforth the absolute obedience to all orders of DAI NIPPON GUN." Circumstances surrounding the signing of the above oath were as follows: For several days preceding, the Japanese Authorities

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had demanded that an oath similar to the above be signed, but the allied officers and men refused. On July 3, the camps rations were reduced by one third, the camp "canteen" was abolished, all buying outside the camp was stopped, all hands were confined to their barracks compound, cooking facilities were reduced by one third, purchases of medical supplies outside the camp were stopped, "late lights" privileges for officers were withdrawn; and Japanese guards began making inspection tours through the barracks, striking men with their fists and with rifle butts and kicking shins with hobnailed shoes. On July 4th, the senior allied officers of the camp were locked up in the Japanese guard house and all other officers were marched out of the camp under and armed guard which made a great show of loading its guns before the assembled officers. The officers were confined in an empty warehouse nearby and meanwhile the men in camp were forced to sign the oath. The Japanese presented an ultimatum worded as follows: 1. We order you to sign the oath. 2. Unless the oath is signed we do not guarantee your lives or status as "prisoners of war". 3. If you sign the oath your life will be guaranteed and you will be treated as a prisener of war. 4. The oath must be signed by 7:00 tonight. After the men in the camp had all signed the oath, the officers were returned to the camp and ordered to sign; which they did.

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July 8: The commanding officer held mast in the case of C. N. Burgard, Seal/c, U.S.N., charged with "leaving camp on a working party without permission", and assigned punishment as follows: To be assigned to outside working party every day for one week.

July 9: Sgt. J. E. Morgan, serving with this command, suffered undetermined injuries to his head when he fell from a truck on an outside Japanese working party. He was taken to the Dutch Military Hospital for treatment. Stanczack, J., MM2/c, returned to this camp from Dutch Military Hospital.

July 10: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Oliver, W. M., Seal/c, charged with "Unauthorized absence from camp hospital", and assigned punishment as follows: 5 hours extra duty.

July 13: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Wilkinson, E. T., Sea2/c, charged with "Unauthorized absence from camp hospital", and assigned punishment as follows: 5 hours extra duty.

July 15: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Guy, J. A., Seal/c,

U.S.N. charged with "Unauthorized absence from camp hospital", and assigned punishment as follows: 5 hours extra duty.

August 3: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Burgard, C.N., Sl/c., U.S.N., charged with "Failure to obey a lawful order of a petty officer", and assigned punishment as follows: Trial by Summary Court Martial.

August 12: The Summary Court Martial of which Lieut.(jg)., L. W. Rogers is senior member met at 1405 in the case of Burgard, C.N., Sl/c., U.S.N., and adjourned at 1430.

August 13: Published finding and sentence in the case of Burgard, C.N., Sl/c., U.S.N., tried by Summary Court Martial on August 12, 1942 for "Failure to obey the lawful order of a petty officer". Finding: Guilty. Sentence: To lose \$25 per month of his pay for a period of four months, total loss of pay amounting to \$100. Proceedings, finding, and sentence approved by convening officer this date. Confinement did not begin immediately because of illness of the accused. 45 days confinement.

August 14: The commanding officer held mast and assigned punishments as follows: Pye, G.E., GM3/c., U.S.N., Bedford, W.J. Sl/c., U.S.N., Williams, J.M., Sl/c., U.S.N., charged with "Leaving the camp hospital without being properly discharged." Pye, G.E., assigned 7 hours extra duty, Bedford, W.J., assigned 7 hours extra duty, and Williams, J.M., warned and returned to hospital.

August 22: By order of the commanding officer, Burgard, C.N., Sl/c., U.S.N., was confined in the camp brig to serve a period of 45 days awarded by summary court martial.

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August 27: By order of the commanding officer, acting on the advice of the Medical Officer, Burgard, C.N., Sl/c., U.S.N., was removed from the camp brig and confined in the camp hospital. September 10: By order of the commanding officer, Burgard, C.N., Sl/c., U.S.N., was confined in the camp brig to continue the sentence assigned by summary court martial on August 13, 1942.

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September 22: The Japanese authorities began paying the working parties as of September 1st. Scale: Officers 20¢ per day; sergeants 15¢ per day; others 10¢ per day.

October 1: All men of the U.S.S. HOUSTON Detachment gave a speciman of their faces to the Japanese Medical Authorities on this date. All men of the U.S.S. HOUSTON Detachment were innoculated on this date by their respective Medical Officers for Bubonic Plague.

October 4: A party of 191 Americans was taken from this camp (Captain A.L. Fitzsimmons, U.S. Army, Senior Officer) including 62 enlisted men from the HOUSTON Detachment. No information as to destination. See appended list of names.

October 10: All officers received their first pay from the Japanese authorities, signing pay lists written in Japanese. Cash actually received by the HOUSTON officers amounted to \$10.80 in Japanese Guilders (occupation money). A party of 68 Americans (Captain L.L. Zeigler, U.S. Army, Senior Officer) was taken from this camp. Included were 30 enlisted men and 2 warrant officers from the HOUSTON Detachment. These men were classed by the Japanese as technicians. They were told that their destination was in a cool climate. By order of the commanding officer, Burgard, C.N., Sealc, U.S. Navy, was released from Confinement. Remainder of sentence suspended.

October 11: A party of 488 Americans left this camp (Lt.Col. B.S. Tharp, Senior Officer) with no information as to destination. The major part of the HOUSTON Detachment was included, 237 enlisted men and 9 officers (Lieut.(jg) H.S. Hamlin Jr., U.S. Navy, Senior Line Officer). Muster list appended. Lt.Col. Tharp's party and Captain Zeigler's party both embarked on SS Dai Nichi Maru at Tanjon Priok. (Tandjoenprick)

October 16: Lt.Col. Tharp's party and Captain Zeiglers party disembarked in Singapore harbor and were removed to Changi P.O.W. camp.

October 27: Captain Zeigler's party of 64 Americans including 27 enlisted men and 2 Warrant Officers were taken from Changi camp. Destination presumably Japan.

October 30: The commanding officer held mast in the case of STARR, M.C., Sealc, U.S. Navy, charged with "Failure to obey the lawful order of a Petty Officer", and assigned punishment as follows: Seven days confinement in the camp brig.

December 2: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Widmeyer, N.C. Seal/c, charged with "Insolence to a Petty Officer and assigned punishment as follows: Five days confinement - sentence suspended - to be executed for any misconduct during a six weeks probation period.

December 8: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Roth, J.T., MM2/c, charged with "Failure to obey the lawful order of a Petty Officer" and assigned punishment as follows: Seven days confinement in the camp brig.

December 31: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Krass, R.G., BMKR 2/c, and Madson, Q.C., Cox, charged with "Insolence to an Allied Officer" and assigned punishment as follows: Five days confinement in the camp brig and six months probation.

1 January 1943: USS Houston Ship's Crew, Prisoners of War in the hands of the Imperial Japanese Army at Changi P.O.W. Camp, Singapore, British Malaya.

Present: Lt.(jg) H. S. Hamlin, USN (Commanding), Lt.(jg) L. W. Rogers, USN, Ensign J. M. Hamill, USN, Ensign J. B. Nelson, USN, Ensign C. D. Smith II, USN, Ensign J. B. Stivers, USNR, Cmdr. W. A. Epstein, MC, USN, Ensign P. R. Clark, SC, USN, 2nd Lt. E. M. Barrett, USMC. 231 Enlisted men USN, 8 Enlisted men USMC, 1 American Citizen, a Flight Sargent in British Air Force (see January 6 1943). This USS Houston Detachment is functioning, together with a part of the 131st Field Artillery USA, as one unit under the command of Lt.Col. B.S.Thorp, USA. All allied forces in this camp (American, British, Dutch, and Australian) are under the command of Col. Holmes R.A. (British).

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January 6: Flight Sargent John Morgan, included in this command, confirmed suspicious of several months standing by admitting that he was a British citizen and had never been to the USA. Sargent Morgan is considered undesirable and will be left in Changi Camp when this unit departs. In order to keep the strength of the party unchanged for the Japanese records, Pvt. Stephen M. McKenzie, British Army, will be included in this party.

January 7: The major part of the "American Unit", under the command of Lt.Col. B. S. Tharp, USA, left Singapore by rail, destination unknown. Party consisted of 25 officers and 431 enlisted men. The major part of the Houston detachment: 8 officers and 211 enlisted men USN, 7 enlisted men USMC, and 1 enlisted man British Army, Lt(jg) H. S. Hamlin, USN commanding, was included. Muster lists appended.

January 9: Arrived Prai, British Malaya (port for Perang) and embarked on SS Moji Maru about 2100. Approximately 385 Australian and 160 Dutch priseners of war were already aboard.

January 12: Underway at 1930 destination unknown.

January 13: Steaming steadily in company with one other Japanese transport and one small patrol craft as escort. Course North to Northwest apparently following coast line about 20 to 50 miles from land. Speed 7 to 10 knots.

January 15: Convoy bombed by the allied planes; apparently 2 "Liberators" and 2 Catalinas at about 1530 (Zone 9). The transport in company (Nichimeiman Maru) was sunk. Near misses killed 2 Australian and 3 Dutch prisoners cutright on the Moji Maru and wounded about 35 others. Americans wounded: Yarbro, R.L., GMLc USN -Foreign body in scalp caused by bomb fragment. Foreign body in back at level of 2nd lumbar vertebrae penetrating left erector spinae; caused by bomb fragment. Moji Maru was not seriously damaged and remained in the vicinity for about four hours picking up survivors (Japanese and Dutch). Forty-three Dutch prisoners killed or missing from sinking of Nichimeiman Maru.

January 16: Two Australian and one Dutch prisoners died as result of wounds sustained in bombing on Jan. 15. Arrived Moulmein, Burma. Disembarked about 1700 and were confined in the Moulmein District Jail.

January 27: The main body of Americans, Australian and Dutch prisoners were moved by rail to Thanbyuzyat (40 kilometres southeast of Moulmein) and by trucks to a railroad construction camp 18 Kilos from Thanbyuzajat. During stay in Moulmein 1 Australian and 3 Dutch prisoners died as a result of wounds sustained in bombing of January 15. The Base Camp at Thanbyuzzat consisted of a Japanese headquarters and a base hospital for the prisoners. The senior Allied officer (Brigadier A.L. Varley AIF) was also at this camp. Other camps were located along the route of the railroad under construction by the Japanese and were designated by their distances from Thanbyuzyat. Prisoners were put to work with pcks and shovels constructing the railroad road bed. Dirt is moved by carrying it in baskets or burlap bags suspended on bamboo poles on the shoulders of the prisoners. Work is alloted for each day by assigning from 1.1 to 1.8 cubic meters of dirt per man tobbe moved. A limited number of men are permitted to work in camp in the kitchen and on sanitary details. All men physically able to go out are required to work. Officers go out in charge of working parties but are not required to work. Officers are paid by the month according to appended schedule. Our own medical staff holds sick call daily and all men not designated as unfit for duty are sent out to work. One day in ten there is a rest for the railroad working party.

March: The personnel of this camp moved by truck to a new construction camp at 85 Km. During the stay in this camp for the first time the Japanese authorities sent men out to work whom the Doctor had designated as unfit for duty, in order to make up a required minimum working strength which they had set.

April: The personnel of this camp moved by foot to a new construction camp at 80 Km.

April 13: White J. H. SF1/c (274-17-82) USN died at about OllO of cerebral malaria. Kondezela, L. F. Seal/c USN died at about 2000 of cerebral malaria. Buried near the 80 Kilo Camp.

April 28: Lusk, J.M.F. Sgt. USMC. Died of malaria. Buried 80 Kilo Camp.

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April 30: The Japanese authorities announced that it would be necessary to work harder to complete this part of the railroad on schedule, and that working parties would work on into the night. A light extra meal would be served them on their return. This is to continue until May 8th.

May 8th: Night work continues. There appears to be more than two weeks work remaining. Sickness has shown a slight increase.

May 15: Received word of the death on 14 May of Dupler, Harvey Harold, 1st Sgt. USMC. Died of dysentery at base hospital at Thanbuzyat.

May 26: The camp did not work today for the first time since 30 April. Night work has continued the entire time, groups returning at various times from 2100 to 0200 each night. Sickness has increased greatly but the prisoners are required to send out a set number each day, so that the sick are forced to work also. Weather is extremely bad.

May 28: The personnel of the 80 Km. camp moved on foot to the 100 Km. camp. Some of the most seriously sick were carried in trucks. At the time the march began the Japanese authorities announced to the Surgeon that they were forced to reduce the number of sick who were to ride, because of a lack of trucks. Japanese private soldiers made the decision of which of the sick would walk, over-riding the protests of the Surgeon, Capt. S. H. Lumpkin, (MC) US Army. Lindsley, A.J. Sl/c USN suffering from dysentery, was made to walk, and collapsed enroute.

1 June: Lindsley, Albert John Seal/c, USN died about 1700 of dysentery. Buried 100 Kilo camp. 100 Kilometer camp is the worst camp to which we have been assigned. The buildings are situated on ground that is very poorly drained and remains marshy. The heads are completely open trenches. The sanitary detail has been abolished and the kitchen force cut down, consequently, there is no one to correct this difficulties. The Japanese authorities refuse to allow us to keep any men in from work to put floors in the barracks, drain the wet areas, improve the heads, etc.

10 June: Willis, Donnis Wayne, Seal/c USN died at about 1730 of dysentery 100 Kilo camp.

17 June: Japanese authorities announced that the 80 Kilo camp would become a hospital, and transferred about 100 men of all nationalities from this camp to 80 Kilo camp, 25 of these being Americans. They will continue to send men there in small groups as necessary.

27 June: Benner, Calvin William, EM3/c died of dysentery at about 1730. 100 Kilo camp.

6 July: Received word of the death, at 80 Kilo camp, of Hutchinson, Bill Martin, Sea2/c, from dysentery, on 5 July. Conditions at 80 Kilo camp reported to be bad, i.e. very little food and no well men to tend the sick.

17 July: Armour, Floyd, Seal/c, died of dysentery and malaria 100 Kilo camp.

22 July: Four men have died of cholera in the last two days (no U.S. Navy).

24 July: Received word of the following deaths at 80 Kilo camp: James, Edward Richard, EM2/c of chronic Beri Beri, on 21 July; Graham, Richard Gresham Yeo3/c of Septicemia caused by tropical ulcers, on 23 July.

1 August: Captain Samuel Hugh Lumpkin, Medical Corps, US Army, the only American Surgeon in camp, died of dysentery.

5 August: Roth, John Thomas, MM2/c died of dysentery, 100 Kilo camp.

7 August: Cdr. W.A.Epstein (MC) USN rejoined this unit from 80 Kilo camp, to which he was transferred from Thanbuyzyat. 12 August: Pye, Guy Edgar GM3/c, died under anesthetic as his leg was being amputated. Cause of death, septicemia, from tropical ulcer on the leg. 100 Kilo Camp.

16 August: Omoth, Robert Engman, Seal/c died at 0645 of heart failure. Parish, Bartow Harrison, AMM2c died at about 1030 of Beri Beri 100 Kilo camp.

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17 August: Branham, Lawrence Randolph, Sea2/c died of tropical ulcers. 100 Kilo camp.

19 August: Received word of the following deaths at 80 Kilo camp: Tucker, William Edward, Musician 2/c on 9 August of tropical ulcer. Hittle, Robert Glen, SC3/c on 17 August of tropical ulcer.

22 August: Manion, Tommy, Jr., Seal/c, died of septicemia caused by tropical ulcer. 100 Kilo camp.

23 August: Kunke, Czeslaus GM2/c died of tropical ulcer. 100 Kilo camp.

24 August: Yates, Donald Ralph Fl/c died of pneumonia and beri beri 100 Kilo camp.

26 August: Received word of the following deaths at 80 Kilo camp: Hansen, Ralph Robert Seal/c on 22 August of dysentery; Reed, Clarence Oscar Radioman 2/c on 23 August of dysentery.

30 August: Bushnell, Edgar Wayne, CSK died from tropical ulcer 100 Kilo camp.

31 August: Pullen, Robert Harold, Seal/c, USN, died from tropical ulcer 100 Kilo camp.

5 September: Ketman, Robert Earl, Jr., Seal/c died of tropical ulcer and dysentery 100 Kilo camp.

6 September: Received word of following deaths at 80 Kilo: Peterson, Lennart Oley GM2/c died of dysentery August 22; and Buhlman Clarence Nelson Sea2/c on 6 Sept of dysentery.

11 September: The commanding officer held mast in the case of Burgard, Carl Norton Seal/c charged with "Disregard of orders" and assigned punishment as follows: To be confined 1 day in the guard house.

12 Beptember: 0800 Burgard, C.N. Seal/c was confined in the guard house. 2200 Burgard, C.N. Seal/c was released. Guy, James Andrew Sea2/c died of Beri Beri 100 Kilo camp.

18 September: Johnson, Edward Irwin SK3/c died of tropical ulcer and dysentery 100 Kilo camp.

19 September: Ebaugh, Forrest Vergil, Sea2/c died of epilepsy (Possible connection with previous operation at Canacao Naval Hosp., and beating by guard at 100 Kilo camp in July. 100 Kilo Camp. Received word of the following deaths at 80 Kilo camp: on 9 Sept. Garwood Edward Dering, RM2/c of tropical ulcer; and Soule, Irvin George GM3/c of dysentery; on 10 Sept. Widmyer, Harry Clark, Seal/c of dysentery; on 11 Sept. Kcelling, Vernon Louis Mus2/c of tropical ulcer; on 14 Sept. De Moen Achiel Rene CEM of tropical ulcer; on 16 Sept Carter, Fredrick Lester Jr., QM3/c, of tropical ulcer; on 18 Sept. Holsinger, Frank Oscar, Corp., USMC of tropical ulcer; on 19 Sept. Wynn Marvin Anglous, Seal/c of dysentery.

21 September: Lee, Earl Henry, Seal/c died of Beri Beri. Ward, Frank Calvin EM3/c died of tropical ulcer. 100 Kilo camp.

27 September: Cooper, Dale Rogers, Photographer3/c died of tropical ulcer. 100 Kilo Camp.

30 September: Received word of the following deaths at 80 Kilo camp: on 26 Sept. Cantrell, James Albert, Sea2/c of Tropical ulcer; on 27 Sept. Baerman, Donald George Seal/c of dysentery.

1 October: The Commanding Officer held mast in the case of Hendricks, Robert Harry, Seal/c, charged with disobedience of orders, and assigned punishment as follows: to be tried by General Court Martial as soon as opportunity permits. 9 1048 6 October: Godfrey, Donald Francis, Seal/c, died of chronic dysentery. 100 Kilo camp.

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10 October: Received word of the following deaths at 80 Kilo camp: on 2 Oct. Hall, Ervin LeRoy, Seal/c of tropical ulcer; on 1 October Batchelor, William Charles, Jr., Seal/c of tropical ulcer.

18 October: McKenzie, Stephen Mason, Bombardier Royal Artillery, British Army (see above 6 Jan. 1943) died at 80 Kilo camp of tropical ulcer.

27 October: For a month, the Japanese have been cleaning up the camp, rebuilding the barracks and generally doing all the thangs that should have been done the week following our arrival. The railroad is finished and in operation, work has been slack. New latrines have been build, marshy areas in the camp drained and everything prepared for the arrival of a "very high officer", a Colonel on an inspection tour. The colonel

21 December: Hatlen, Edwin Arthur, Slc, USN (300-10-01), died of beri-beri at 100 Kilo Camp.

22 December: Young, Kenneth Asa, SL/c, USN, (311-46-50), died of beri-beri, malaria and dysentery at 105 Kilo Camp.

26 December: Pistole, Frank Lyle Harold, AMM3/c, USN, (300-10-73), died of beri-beri and dysenter at 105 Kilo Camp.

27 December: First group of a total of three groups left from this camp (100 Kilo) for what the Japanese term a "rest camp" at Kanchanabri, Thailand. Group consisted of Dutch, Australians, and Americans - 62 officers and men (mixed U.S. Army and Navy). Group departed by train.

28 December: Second group left for Kanchanabri (45 American officers and men plus Dutch and Australians) Group departed by train.

29 December: Third and last group left for Kanchanabri. (62 American officers and men plus Dutch and Australians. All three groups going to Kanchanabri consisted mainly of sick. With the exception of three U.S. Army medical orderlies, the American medical detachment (Senior Officer Comdr. W.A. Epstein, MC, USN) went with the sick to Kanchanabri. Officer commanding Kanchanabri group is Lt.Col. B.S.Tharp, US Army. Senior Naval Officer Kanchanabri group is Lt.(jg) H.S. Hamlin, Jr., USN. Group remaining in 100 Kilo camp composed of 12 officers and 132 men (Army and Navy). Major W.H. Rogers, US Army commanding. Senior Naval Officer 100 Kilo camp is Ensign J. M. Hamill, USN. U. S. Army group at 100 Kilo camp consists of 8 officers and 58 enlisted men. U. S. Navy group at 100 Kilo camp consists of 4 officers and 74 enlisted men.

* The colonel arrived today, came in the gate, was saluted by a "guard of honor" of prisoners, took a cup of tea with the commandant, and 8 minutes after he had disembarked from his truck, was back in it and on his way without ever having been in the prisoners' part of the camp. 11/9/43 - Spencer, Mason Dale, S2/c, died dysentery, 80 Kilo.

9 November: Abrams, Russell Eugene, Yeo3/c, died of beri-beri at 80 Kilo camp.

26 November: Hirschberg, Louis, FC2/c, USN, died of tropical ulcer 100 Kilo camp.

28 November: Feely, James John Sea2/c, died of beri-beri at 80 Kilo camp.

6 December: The administration of this group of prisoners which left Singapore on 7 January, was transferred, this group being amalgamated with the other Burma prisoners, Senior Allied Officer being Brig. A.L. Varley, AIF. The sick at 80 kilo were immediately moved to 105 kilo camp.

11 December: Trim, Donald Paul, Cox., died of tropical ulcer at 105 kilo camp.

- 9 -7 January 1944: Received information that group of sick Americans which had been transferred from 80 Kilo camp to 105 Kilo camp had been moved by rail to

Kanchanabri. 20 Americans moved from 114 Kilo camp to 105 Kilo camp. Seaman 2/c R. L. Hanley attached as medical orderly. Navy members of group as follows: Pvt. Page, USMC, M.L. Forsman Seal/c, Smith, J.A. Sea2/c, and Ewing, J.C. Sea2/c, US Navy.

26 January: Personnel of 100 Kilo camp moved by road march to 105 Kilo camp. At 105 Kilo camp received four Americans from hospital (Men were left behind by group leaving 105 Kilo camp for Kanchanabri) Names as follows: Morrow and Harris (army) and Daniels Bkr3/c USN and Pryor Sgt.USMC. Seaman 2/c P.M.George also joined group. George had left group at Batania, Java October 3, 1942 with group commanded by Capt. A.L. Fitzsimmons, US Army. L.C.Bird left 105 Kilo camp for Bangkok, Thai. to act as sculptor on a monument to Allied P.O.W. dead who worked on the Burma-Thai. railroad. Three Americans including L.C.Bird, Fl/c,USN who had volunteered as stone masons to build stone memorial for P.O.W. deaths in constructing Burma-Thai railway left camp 105 Kilo. Destination given by Japanese as Bangkok.

31 January: Headquarters for Allied P.O.W. in Burma moved from 70 Kilo to 105 Kilo camp. Lt.Col. Anderson, AIF, Senior Officer. Following Americans attached to headquarters staff arrived in 105 Kilo camp: L.H.Harris, AMML/c, J.O.Reas, Yeo2/c, H.S.Strickland, FL/c, and R.M.Glover, Seal/c.

4 February: Received report of following deaths: Hendricks, R.H. (311-33-93) Seal/c, dysentery, 30 December 1943, buried Kanchanabri, Thai.; Callahan, M.C. (360-15-38) Seal/c, tropical ulcer and pneumonia, Jan. 4, 1944, buried 133 Kilo camp, Burma; Scheulke, J.H. (393-33-63) SC2/c, dysentery, buried Kanchanabri, Thai. Deceased soldiers reported at same date: Corp. B.R.Williamson Jan. 28, 1944, Tamarkhan, Thai. Corp. H.W.Eastwood, Jan. 28, 1944, Tamarkhan, Thai. Pvt. S.M.Bussey, Jan. 18, 1944, Kanchanabri, Thai. Pvt. W.H.Dickins, Jan. 1, 1944, 114 Kilo camp. Pvt. R.L.Kklund, Jan. 5, 1944, 114 Kilo camp. Pvt. G.E.Potts, Jan. 14, 1944, 114 Kilo camp. Pvt. J.W. Rogers, Jan. 28, 1944, Tamarkhan, Thai. Pvt. R.J.Bowley, Jan. 23, 1944, Kanchanabri, Thai. Pvt. W.H.Simpson, Jan. 30, 1944.

22 February: Three Americans including L.O.Gilliam, CML/c, USN left camp 105 Kilo for Kanchanabri.

24 February: F.D.Ellis, CWT, USN died of dysentery and malaria. Buried 105 Kilo camp.

29 February: 47 Americans including one Naval officer and 17 naval enlisted men left camp 105 Kilo for Kanchanabri. Major W.H.Rogers, US Army, commanding group. Senior Naval Officer Ensign J.B.Nelson, USN.

9 March: J.C.Reas, Y2/c, USN left camp 105 Kilo for Kanchanabri.

14 March: Seven Americans including C.L.Pryor, Sgt., USMc left camp 105 Kilo for Kanchanabri.

17 March: Four Americans including W.J.Bedford, Sl/c,USN and M.L.Forsman, Sl/c, USN left camp 105 Kilo for Kanchanabri.

18 March: 47 Americans including 24 Naval enlisted men and 3 Marine enlisted men left camp 105 Kilo for reputed destination of Japan according to information given by Japanese authorities. (see service records).

22 March: 19 Americans including 14 Naval enlisted men left camp 105 Kilo for reputed destination of Japan. (See service records). P.M.George, S2/c, USN and R.J. Herman, S1/c,USN left camp 105 Kilo for Kanchanabri.

23 March: Camp 105 Kilo machine gunned by two "Liberator" aircraft. Casualties: one Dutch soldier killed.

27 March: Ten Americans including three naval enlisted men left camp 105 Kilo for Kanchanabri.

5 April: Camp 105 Kilo machine gunned and railroad track immediately in front of 105 Kilo camp bombed by four "Liberator" aircraft. Casualties: one Dutch soldier killed by machine gun bullet. 10 April: Remaining Americans left camp 105 Kilo for Kanchanabri. Group of twenty Americans included three naval officers, six naval enlisted men, and one marine enlisted man. Americans remaining in Burma at this date are as follows: Burgard, C.N., Sl/c, USN, Oliver, W.M., Jr., Sl/c, USN, Strickland, H.S., Fl/c, USN, Harris, L. H., AMMI/c, USN, and Embrock, Pvt., 131st F.A., U.S. Army. These men are acting as drivers and mechanics under Japanese orders.

11 April: Group of twenty Americans arrived in Kanchanabri and were quartered in camp No. 3. For camp numbers of men in Kanburi (Kanchanabri) see service records. Received word of death of Blair, K.S., CSM (AA), USN on March. Cause of death dysentery; place of burial Kanchanabri.

About 25 June 1944: 35 Americans left camp No. 3 today on Japan party. They are in a party with Br., Dutch, and Australians under the command of Flight Lt. J. Sutherland, RAAF (Later info rec'd. - this party arrived in Singapore and were quartered in River Valley Camp - embarked for Japan in late fall, about mid-November and arrived in Fukuoka, Kyushyu).

26 July: No. 3 camp joined to adjacent Br. camp known as Hq. Camp. All men from No. 3 transferred to 7 Branch. Officers commence working at manual labor because Japanese Commandant says we must make up labor shortage caused by Japan parties. Officers from Thailand Branches have been forced to work from beginning, June 1942. Many bashings of officers result. One Br. Capt. and a Dutch Lt.Col. arms broken.

7 August: Sick party for Narkom - Paton left camp, Americans included in charge of Lt. J. B. Heinen, 131 FA, USA.

4 December: Capt Noquchi takes command of camp and worse treatment results. Much allied plane activity in December about Tamurkan Bridge, Jap. Camps in Kanburi Area, and Nong Pla Duk. Many Allied POWs killed and wounded, no Americans. 14 in Tamarkan and 96 in Nong Pla Duk killed.

January 1945: Order received that Kanburi Camp will become an Officers camp only, enlisted men moved out to Tamarkan, Chon Kai, Tamwan, later some of these move on to Rajburi. Sole American Officer with troops, Comdr. W. A. Epstein, (MC), USN.

Large scale searches and arrests of POWs and Thais by Kempei (Jap. Secret Police)

over sale of newspapers and black market trading. Americans arrested are Major W.M. Rogers, Capt. W. D. Parker, 131 FA, Thomas, C.L., and Forsman, M.L., Seamenl/c, USN. About 100 involved. Tales of torture reported. All 4 sentenced to 5 yrs at hard labour and transported to Singapore Prison.

February 1945: Officers move in while camp is still being built and crowded into bays, 5 men to 4 meters. Camp to hold 3200 - camp area 350 yds by 200 yds. All sick officers moved from Narkom Paton Hospital camp, Japs overriding protests of POW doctors and surgeons. Among these is Ensign John B. Stivers, AVN, USNE, suffering from a brain tumour. One operation on Jan. 31 had been performed and several others were necessary later. Many times POW Commanding Officer requested his transfer to decent hospital facilities where Lt.Col. Coates (MC) AIF could operate, but reply from Col. Sugasawa and Capt. Noguchi always negative.

A protest to Jap. Staff Officer about Red Cross supplies taken over by Japs for own use (estimated at 90% - 95%). Received this reply: "The Red Cross is an international organization. Therefore, Japanese troops are as much entitled to them as you prisoners".

March 1945: Capt. Ira Fowler, 131 F.A., U.S.A., returned to Kanburi Camp from Saigon. He reported death of Tonberg, A.N., Bkr3/c, USN, date____, cause malaria, buried in Saigon, 3 officers killed.

About April: Several badly wounded when 2 bombs fall into camp.

June 1945: All officers in Konburi Camp placed under two week restriction by order of Capt. Noguchi. No definite reason given. Not allowed use of slit trenches during air attacks. Only hospital sick allowed to line down during daylight, no games, no lectures, very poor food, water ration cut, many bashings.

July 1945: Officers to move in groups of 400 to new camp about 100 K. NE of Bangkok. Move to be completed by 25 August. First party in command of Lt. Col. Toosey, 135 Field Regt, acting C.O. all POWs in Thailand left on 2 July. Camp command reverts to Lt.Col. Swinton, East Surrey Regt., Senior Br. Officer, Thailand.

15 August 1945: 6th party leaves, including 17 American Officers, Lt.Col. B. S. Thorp, 131 FA., in charge of Americans, Heavy sick including Ensign Stivers moved over protest of P.O.W. doctors and surgeons.

16 August 1945: At 2100 Jap Major from PON Staff in Bangkok arrived and gave official notice of end of war. Korean guards disarmed and turned out by Japs to fend for themselves. Jap Camp Guards to remain armed and on duty until other orders received. Contact between ex PON and Thai Gov., Lt.Col. Montri, established. Extra food and medicine sent.
