Report on enforced prostitution in Western Sumaco, I. L. I. S.

Japanese Naval Occupation.

During the first half of 1943 the naval garrison Commander of Pontianak, Lt. Col. U. M. A. KAWAI returned to Japan about August 1943, (detention requested) issued an order that no Japanese was to have intimate relations with Indonesian or Chinese women. At that time all European and practically all Indo-European woman were informed. At the same time he issued the order for the establishment of official brothels. These brothels were to be divided in two groups: three establishments for use of Navy personnel only and five or six for the use of civilians, of which latter one was reserved for the higher officials of the Naval Civil Administration. (Minscibu).

The brothels for Naval personnel were run by the garrison. Under the C. M., the signals Officer, Lt. Sadao KITURI was placed in charge and the daily business was attended to by the duty warrant Officer, Sgt. Maj. M. E. SHOJI. Women who had had relations with Japanese were forced into these brothels, which were surrounded by barbed wire. They were only allowed on the streets with special permission. Permission to quit the brothel had to be obtained from the garrison commander. The Social Naval Police (Tokai Tai) had orders to keep the brothels supplied with women; to this end they arrested women on the streets and after enforced medical examination placed them in the brothels. These arrests were mainly effected by the Sgt. Majors MILITA JUKICHI, KOJIMA GOICHI, KUSI KAZUO, and KIO YOSHIO.

The brothels for civilians were run by KANAI HISAEIJI, manager of Nonyo Kohatsu K. K. The garrison - commander ordered the Minscibu to attend to this. The Minscibu passed this on to the Hokokukai (Organization of Japanese Businessmen) Kanaki being in charge of the Welfare Department of the Hokokukai, was placed in charge of the brothels for civilians; he used employees of his firm for the routine work, as keeping of accounts, etc. Every morning the nights takings were turned in to the cashier of Nonyo Kohatsu, KIKIYA MAGETADA. Women for these brothels were also obtained through the services of Tokai Tai.

The houses for the brothels were obtained from the custodian of enemy property, the furniture was in the case of the naval brothels supplied by the Navy and in case of the civilian brothels by the Hokokukai. Visitors had to pay to the native servant (in the case of the Navy according to rank) who turned in the money daily to the duty warrant Officer or to the cashier of Nonyo Kohatsu. In both cases 1/3 was retained to defray expenses, furniture, food, etc. and 2/3 was credited to the woman concerned. Of this they could from time to time take up part for their personal use. A monthly statement had to be rendered to Section I of the Minscibu.

In their search for women the Tokai Tai ordered the entire female staffs of the Minscitu and the Japanese firms to report to the Tokai Tai Office, undressed some of them entirely and accused them of maintaining relations with Japanese. The ensuing medical examination revealed that several were virgins. It is not known with certainty how many of these unfortunate were forced into brothels. Women did not dare to escape from the brothels as members of their family were then immediately arrested and severely maltreated by the Tokai Tai. In one case it is known that this caused the death of the mother of the girl concerned.

Fortunately Dr. Lubulina of Ketapang, an Indonesian medical Officer, who was allowed to continue in practice during the occupation was still available and able to make a sworn statement regarding his medical examination of women by order of Tokai Tai personnel. His evidence shows that women were forced into prostitution.

The above report has been compiled from information obtained from interrogation of Japanese war criminals and from sworn statements by persons concerned.

I declare that the above facts are truly in accordance with above sources of information on my oath as an Intelligence Officer and interpreter of the Japanese language.

PRO JUSTITIA.AFFIDAVIT OF INTERROGATION.SUMMARY OF EXAMINATION OF:

Duly sworn states:

I was interned in the Camp MOENTILAN as a civil internee. On the 28th January 1944 I was told by our female section-leader Mrs. "REITSMA" to appear at the Japanese Camp Office. Here I saw a Javanese Inspector of Police, who took me to the Police Station outside the camp together with six other women and girls. Their names were: "ANNIE HOOPANS", Mrs. "ZELSTRA", Mrs. "PLEKKER", Mrs. "VROUT", Mrs. "KEYKOOP" and Mrs. "de LEGE".

After we had returned to the camp under the guidance of the Javanese police-inspector and had packed our trunks, the latter took us back to the Japanese Camp-Office. Here we were handed over to the three Japs, by whom we were transported in 3 private cars to MAGULANG where we arrived at 4 p.m. We were taken to a small camp, called TOEGOERAN, consisting of 14 houses. We met a group of women and girls here who had been taken from our camp on the 25th January 1944.

On the 3rd February 1944 we were again medically examined by the Japanese doctors, this time the girls included. Thereon we were informed that we were intended for a Japanese brothel. In the evening of that day the brothel was to be opened. After coming home, Mrs. "PLEKKER" and myself closed all the doors and windows. At about 9 p.m. there was a knock at the doors and windows; we were told to open them and not to close either doors or windows. We did so, with the exception of the bedroom, where I locked myself in. I repeated this until Sunday 5th February; on that occasion also Japanese soldiers entered the camp (before only Japanese officers). Some of these soldiers entered and one of them drew me along to my room. I resisted until a KEPPEI-official entered and told me that we had to receive the Japs, for if we were not willing, our husbands, whose whereabouts were known, would be held responsible. After this information he left me along with the soldier. Even then I offered further resistance, but as a matter of fact I got the worst of it; he tore my clothes from my body and twisted my arms on my back, so that I was powerless, whereafter he compelled me to have sexual intercourse with him. I do not know who this soldier was, neither do I know the name of the KEPPEI-official.

Things went on like this for three weeks. On working-days the brothel was open for Jap officers, on Sundays in the afternoon for Jap N.C.O's, whereas Sunday mornings were reserved for Jap soldiers. The brothel was occasionally visited by Jap civilians. I always resisted, but in vain.

Towards the end of February or the first days of March 1944 I was told to appear at the office, where a Jap officer was present called "TAKIGUDJE", who promised to investigate

into the matter on the grounds of my complaints regarding the treatment I had experienced. He also promised to do his utmost to have us sent back to an internment camp. He at once improved things for us by closing the brothel for soldiers, N.C.O's and civilians.
