Campbell states on 11 April 1942, near Cababin Air Field, a member of the Imperial Japanese Army struck him a sharp blow on the back of his head which caused him to fall to the ground semi-conscious. He was kicked several times and was thrust in the right side of his back and in his forehead with a bayonet. He heard several shots fired and a PsW fell on his face to the ground during the firing. He did not move after he fell.
