Cpl. Elvin Lee McGowan states at Camp Kamioke, Cpl. Montana ordered a surprise shake-down of the camp and found cooked rice, salt, dried fish and other miscellaneous things in the quarters of J.T. Fite, Charles Chaffin, Bert Riggs, John Lapard and Salvador Nocera. They were burned with red hot irons. Beaten for one day and placed in the guardhouse overnight without clothing. Next day they were placed, naked, in front of the headquarters to do push-ups until they were exhausted. When they collapsed they were beaten with clubs and wooden rifles. Nagasi, Shemoda and "The Wolf" are accused.
