Mrs. Emma Rose Cochran states that her cousin Frederico Falek was captured by the Japanese at Lucena, Tayabas and accused of being a guerilla. Falek was held in jail for a period of one week and on each day of his incarceration he was beaten with a whip. One of the days water was forced into his body and on another bamboo splinters were jabbed into his stomach. Another method of torture inflicted upon Falek was hanging him by his thumbs for long periods of time. Cochran states that Falek bore many scars and he was in a state of complete exhaustion.
