- The inclosed report is forwarded in accordance with your verbal 1. request for information on the extent to which German and Russian scientific research and technical developments contributed to Japaness development of secret weapons. This report is based largely on the so-called Compton Report entitled, "Report on Scientific Intelligence Furvey in Japan, September and October, 1945".
 - 2. Neither the Compton Report, nor the other sources contacted in the course of preparing the inclosed study (Patents Division CPC, ESS, G-2 Historical Library, Technical Intelligence Detachment Files, ATIS Geographical Section) reveal any considerable German or Russian contribution to Japanese research in secret weapons,
 - 3. The Compton Report drew the following general conclusions re the extent and usefulness of German - Japanese collaboration in Scientific and technical subjects:
 - a. "The Japanese scientists, industrial representatives, and Army and Navy Technical Officers agree in maintaining stoutly that, with a few exceptions, Japan received very little help from Germany (or Italy) on new technical developments. The most important exception was in the field of underwater sound where the Germans evidently gave considerable help..... Another exception was in the case of an early warning radar set (the Murtzburg) for which the Germans apparently gave the Japanese complete specifications. A Gerwan engineer, Heinrich Foders, was also sent out to help get these sets into production, but progress was slow. Three sets were built but only one set was actually gotten into experimental operation before the end of the war".
 - b. "A number of other German technicians were sent to Japan during the later years of the war, but they were mostly specialists in mechanical design, plant construction, or production, rather than in research and development. Several of them are still in this country and three, in addition to Foders, have been interviewed by members of the Survey group. They were unanimous in their scorn and dislike of the Japanese and felt that their missions had accomplished very little".
 - c. "The Germans also gave some help on methods of producing HoOo which the Japanese expected to use as fuel in rockets and jet-propelled aircraft. In addition, a sample of a chemical warfare decontaminating agent was brought to Japan by a Japanese returning from Cermany by submarine,

and a Naval Attache returning from Germany also brought the information that the Germans were working on Nitrogen Mustards. It is not clear, however, that these actions had been authorized by the Germans."

d. "In 1943, Col. Satake, in charge of ground radar research at the Tama Technical Maboratory, paid a visit to Germany. He reports that the Germans were free in showing him equipment which they had in field use but refused to give him any information about new developments under way, and denied him admission to any of the laboratories where research and development were in progress."

A. There is little reference in the inclosed study to Russian research and technical developments, which is in itself revealing. In general, it may be said that from the commencement of World War II, Japan had very little actual knowledge as to Russian technical and scientific research. A considerable amount of information was gathered by the Japanese on Russian military tactics and standard pre-war military equipment, but this was apparently the extent of their factual knowledge. Fome slight information on Russian chemical warfare agents was supplied Japan by the Germans as noted in inclosed report. A Japanese document (Japanese classification - most secret) suggests that the Japanese knew or believed they knew of extensive Russian experimental work in the field of bacteriological warfare. Nothing that has come to the attention of G-2 to date, however, indicates any significant Russian influence on Japanese experiments in bacteriological warfare.

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
