Item 9. (p.5) Cable from MIURA to ARITA, 26 Mar 1940; No. 136.

"YANO, who returned from NANKING, tells me that Investigator KUWABARA, of the Central China Liaison Dept of the China Affairs Board, presented to the UFE (Plum Blossom) Agency a proposal, which he calls a tentative proposal by the Vice-Chief KUSUNOKO, on 23 Mar at NANKING. Major General KAGESA is said to have flatly refused the proposal. He seems to suspect that the proposal is an attempt on the part of the China Affairs Board to retain the Liaison Dept until the end of the Affair, together with the right of direction by the China Affairs Board over the Ambassador, and to secure the right of direction to a certain degree even after the official recognition (of the New China Regime)."

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Item 10. (pp. 5-6) Cable from ARITA to Japanese Ambassadors and Consuls, 26 Mar 1940.

"Prior to the recognition of the New Regime, a special envoy, as stipulated by the Imperial Ordinance No. 64 of 1917, shall be sent, to dispose of the so-called 'collaboration' business under the jurisdiction of the China Affairs Board.....The said Ambassador will confer with the Highest Army and Navy Commanders on the spot, concerning the execution on the spot of important policies based on the decision by the Home Govt, and matters of public peace and order, but the Army and Navy Commanders do not instruct or direct the Ambassador. (The relations between the Ambassador, the China Affairs Board, and the Army and Navy Commanders shall be a strict secret)"

Item 15. (p.8) Cable from HORI to ARITA, 27 Mar 1940; No. 93.

"The expression 'The Imperial Government firmly believes that the Reborn New China also will proceed along the same line', is needless for our side, and moreover detrimental to the prestige of CHINA. So both the WING group and the Plum Blossom Agency hope it may be struck out.

The expression 'especially----has particular interest and demand regarding the exploitation and utilization of resources of CHINA', is too frank to be desirable. The Military Headquarters, the Plum Blossom Agency, and the local naval authorities combine in strongly desiring its being struck out."

Item 17. To Foreign Minister ARITA from Ambassador UELZU, 28 Mar 1940; No. 126.

Inquiry about the time of issuance of Japan's statement on the day of the establishment of Chinese Central Government.

Item 20. To Foreign Minister ARITA from Consul-General KATO, 28 Mar 1940, Tsingtao; No. 149.

"Matters which have come to our knowledge in reference to the establishment of the New Central Government."

1. Freedom of the New Govt is hopeless----insufficiency of support by Chinese public,

2. U.S. attitude----adverse.

Item 21. (p.11) Cable from UCHIDA to ARITA, 28 Mar 1940; No.87.

"After consulting with the Navy and the China Affairs Board, the following has been decided:

Japanese Navy, Army and public offices will use only the Japanese flag, but civilian agencies may use the five-colour flag, (T.N. Chinese flag) if circumstances make it necessary."

Item 23. To Foreign Minister ARITA from Councillor FUJII, 29 Mar 1940, Peking; No. 127 "SECRET".

"In North China and Mongolia Japan will not hoist the New Chinese flag."

Item 65. (p.27) FUJII to ARITA, 10 Apr 1940.

(Summary): Information Chiefs of Army, Navy diplomatic service and China Affairs Board met at the Consulate-General (SHENGHAI) to confer about the propaganda, especially newspaper and radio, policy. Furthermore, it was decided on that occasion that information chiefs should form the Japanese committee for news liaison and meet twice a month at NANKING and SHENGHAI alternately to establish liaison.

Item 66. To Foreign Minister ARITA from Councillor FUJII, 10 Apr 1940, Peking; No. 298 "SECRET".

(Summary): Chief of the new government's KOSHI-IN (Deliberative Council) WANG, talks about his duties and services with FUJII.

Item 72. To Foreign Minister ARITA from Councillor FUJII, 12 Apr 1940, Peking; No. 305.

"In the course of conversation with WANG, TADA (T.N. Commander in China) said that 'It is needless to say that Japanese army stationed in North China will offer general support for the development of the New Chinese Government. However, should the new government collapse, we cannot but take steps for concentrating on North China from the Anti-Comintern point of view.'"

Item 79. (p.31) MATSUMOTO (Nanking) to ARITA, 15 Apr 1940; No. 19 "SECRET".



"CHIN Kung-po spoke to me on the 11th as follows:

As regards the adjustment of Japanese-Chinese relations, it must be the first consideration to bring about peace as fast as possible. As regards diplomatic policy towards the third powers, the New Regime must thoroughly conform to the Japanese policy, so it desires to be given frequent opportunities to consult with the Ambassador IBE, after his arrival in NANKING, so that it may become fully acquainted with the diplomatic policies of JAPAN, and take most effective measures in close liaison with JAPAN."

Item 93. (p.37) MIURA to ARITA, 4 May 1940.

(Summary): Establishment of Central and local taxation offices, and the appointment of Chief of the National Taxation Office (a Chinese).

Item 96. (p.39) Guiding Principle and Program for the Diplomatic Policy of the New Central Regime (of China) 9 Feb 1940, (Diplomatic Agency).

"The New Regime shall thoroughly liquidate dependence on Europe and America, realizing the independent character of the East Asia and the solidarity of JAPAN, MANCHUKUO and CHINA. To bring about the realization, the discarding of the Nine-Power Pact and Secession from the League of Nations is necessary. But it shall be carried out after consultation with JAPAN, at an opportune moment in the future."

Item 135. (p.52) To Japanese Ambassadors to Britain, America, etc., from ARITA, 19 Jun 1940.

"The Japanese Government wants to follow the policy of recognizing the New Regime in CHINA, through the form of the conclusion of a treaty. There are, however, some elements in this country that do not believe in the New Regime. So, if the New Regime does not succeed in winning popularity at least in NANKING and SHINGHAI areas, JAPAN's support of the New Regime may become less enthusiastic, and JAPAN's original policy of fostering the New Regime, thereby to weaken CHUNGKING, may become more difficult of achievement. Here is a great problem for us....."

SUMMARY OF RELEVANT POINTS

Report covers disposition and activity of Japanese forces in Indo-China, particularly with reference to early 1945. In February of that year the Japanese forces, because of the change in the tides of the war, and based on a Supreme War Council decision, were to disarm French forces and take other necessary measures if the Governor-General did not accede to demands which would have placed the French and Indo-Chinese forces directly under the command of the Japanese military. The Governor-General's answer was qualified, and therefore considered negative. The Japanese then proceeded to disarm all said troops, and met heavy losses in the north, according to the report.
