

Prisoner of War Camps

Mentioned in Red Cross Prisoners of War Bulletin, ^{filed in 102-12} Vol. 2, No. 8, August 1944:

1. Fukuoka group, Honshu Island, Japan.
Nineteen branch camps.
2. Fukuoka Branch Camp No. 17.
On April 24, 1944, contained 501 Americans, of whom ten were officers and the rest EM, all from the Philippines. Since the camp had opened five prisoners had died, four of pneumonia and one of a heart attack.
3. Fukuoka Branch Camp No. 12.
On April 25, 1944, contained 397 Dutch and 3 American medical orderlies.
4. ~~Zentsuji, Japan.~~
On April 28, 1944, main camp contained 309 American officers, 190 British officers, 69 Dutch officers, 116 American EM, 6 British EM. Five deaths had occurred since the opening of the camp. Visited by Red Cross delegate April, 1944.
5. ~~Mukojima.~~
Formerly a branch camp in Fukuoka group, now Zentsuji Branch No. 4.
6. ~~Innoshima.~~
Formerly a branch camp in Fukuoka group, now Zentsuji Branch Camp No. 2.
7. Kobe, Japan
Four civilian camps, in residential district overlooking city. In March 1944 contained 206 internees of whom 133 were Americans (129 of them from Guam).
8. Shanghai War Prisoners Camp.
Writer of letter dated 26 December 1943 is W. W. Ashurst, Colonel, U. S. Marine Corps. Letter also mentions Major Devereux and Reverend Nakiyama as being in camp.
9. Camp No. 4, Philippines.
10. Hiraoka Camp, Japan.
11. Osaka Camp, Japan.
12. Branch Camp 2, Tokyo.

PRISONER OF WAR CAMPS

Mentioned in Red Cross Prisoners of War Bulletin, ^{filed in 102} Vol. 2, No. 9, September 1944:

1. Taiwan, Formosa camps.
Six camps contain 235 Americans. General Wainwright was at Camp II. Captain Scholey was at Camp III. General Beebe was at Camp IV.
2. Karenko, Taiwan, Formosa.
Closed when Red Cross delegate visited Taiwan in 1944.
3. Tamagato, Taiwan, Formosa.
Closed when Red Cross delegate visited Taiwan in 1944.
4. Hong Kong.
All but one of the American prisoners are officers and men of the vessel Admiral Y. S. Williams.
5. ~~Java~~
6. ~~Zentsuji War Prison Camp, Japan.~~
Writer of postcard dated 25 January 1944 mentions Lt. JJA Michel who was an officer on the USS Pope.
Writer of letter dated December 1943 states Fassett, Wilson and I are the only Pope personnel in this camp. There are 29 English, Dutch, Australian and American officers in my room, and, as you suspect, I have made a number of friends among the nearly 700 residents here. Jake Vandergrift, Mead Wilson, Hugh Mellon, Ed Wood, and Joe Martin are some of the naval officers.
7. Camp Hoten, Manchuria.
8. Osaka Camp, Japan.
9. Niigata Camp, Japan.
Belongs to Tokyo group, located north of Tokyo - Contains American prisoners from Philippines, British, Canadian, and Dutch prisoners from Hong Kong. Contains about 200 Americans, including a few officers.










