

17. REMARKS OR EYEWITHESS STATEMENTS:

Prisoner of War Mission No. 8 was flown on 4 September 1945 to the Japanese mainland. Captain Sompayrac and crew were in T-21. The Tokyo and Nagoya areas were flown over in an effort to locate a POW camp sufficiently in the clear to drop the supplies, to no avail. Captain Sompayrac then proceeded down the coast to coordinates 37°1′N - 140°52′E, where he was joined by Captain Black in T-7 and T-3 of the 873rd Bomb Squadron. Inter-plane radio contact was established and Captain Sompayrac advised the other two aircraft to remain out over the water and circle and further advised that he was going to try and get under the undercast and locate a POW camp known to be in this vicinity. The ceiling over the bay was estimated at 600 feet, and over land at 300 feet. Peaks on the mainland could be clearly seen over the undercast. In the last radio message received from Captain Sompayrac he stated that he was following a railroad track which according to his maps would lead them to the POW camp. He also stated that maneuvering space was extremely limited. Captain Black estimated that T-21 was approximately ten miles inland at the time of the reception of this message. T-7 and T-3 continued to circle for approximately 30 minutes, but no further contact was established with T-21. T-3 radioed Iwo Jima, advising them of the situation and asked for instructions. Since no instructions were forthcoming, and since the computed fuel reserve was such that further sustained flight was out of the question, both aircraft returned to base.
