PARAPHRASE OF TELEGRAM SENT

FROM: Secretary of State, Washington.

and Omori wards during April according to Japanese radio broadcasts. The Department is concerned to learn that, according to your despatches No. 11335 and No. 11336, both dated April 4, when the Swiss representative visited the Omori prisoner of war camp and the Shinagawa prisoner of war hospital, they were still located in a bombardment area. If these camps have not been moved since the Swiss representative's visit, a strong protest along the following lines should be made to the Japanese Government by the Swiss Government through Gorge:

Reliable information has been received by the Government of the United States that the prisoner of war camp, Omori, is situated between industrial installations from 500 meters to 1000 meters away and that Higashi Shinagawa prisoner of war hospital at Tokyo is located near a port which is on the road to and close to bonded warehouses. Provision is made by the Geneva Prisoner of War Convention under Article 9 whereby protection from bombardment of certain regions or certain points may not be obtained by the use of the

Government of the United States demands the immediate removal to a safety zone of the occupants of the Omori prisoner of war camp and the Shinagawa hospital. The United States Government also demands that the Japanese Government furnish a report regarding the transfer and the new locations.

United States that the Japanese authorities responsible for the Japanese Government's failure to remove from danger zones prisoner of war camps, including the above-mentioned camp and hospital, will meet with the most serious consequences.
