Commander Task Group and Officer in Tactical Command is Rear Admiral D. Ketcham, U.S.N. (ComCarDiv#27) in the U.S.S. BLOCK ISLAND (CVE106). 0920 Task Unit 77.1.2, the U.S.S. CHEPACHET (A0#78) and the U.S.S. WALTON (DE361) joined the formation.

Cause of death was drowning. 1831 Burial services were held aboard the U.S.S. FINCH for Lieut. Comdr. Gang at latitude 23 -04*N, longitude 129 -05 E. 1930 A heavy swell breaking over the port bow resulted in the following material damgage: Two forward staterooms on gallery deck, port side, had contents damaged and deck tilted upward. Number 4 gun mount sponson was tilted upward; catwalk forward of Mount number 2 was destroyed. 2100 Jettisoned about 100 rounds of 40MM ammunition which had been damaged by the heavy seas.

KRETCHNER (DE329). 2202 Completed transfer of evacuees, having received a total of one hundred and fifty-five (155) officers and men of British nationality from the Malayan Forces comprised of various units of the British and Indian Armies who were made prisoners of war on 15 February 1942 at Singapore and various other places in Malaya. Evacuees are from Camp Kinkasaski and another prison camp on Formosa of undetermined name, generally referred to as "The Jungle Camp". Senior officer among the evacuees is Captain J. E. R. Francke, #ST124 of the Royal Indian Army Service Corps. The evacuees were de-loused, treated for Pediculosis, Dysentary, Beri Beri, Malnutrition and various other diseases and conditions; issued clothing and berthed on the hangar deck.

Ten (10) officers and men are from the Dutch Army and Merchant Marine who were captured in Java. Evacuees are from Camp Taihoku, located in northern Formosa.
