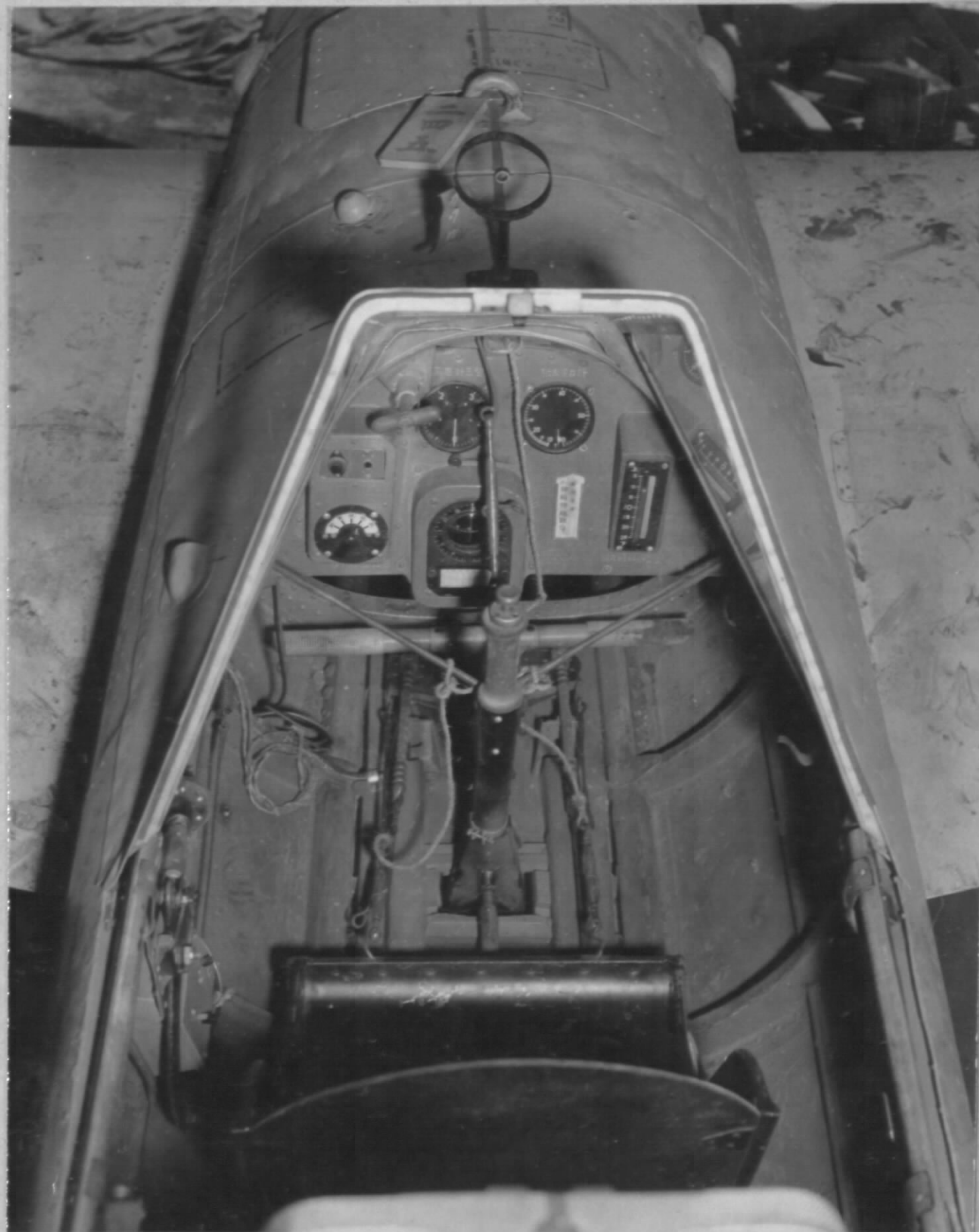

The *BAKA bomb was a new Jap rocket plane which was carried like a torpedo under the fuselage of a standard type mother plane. (Betty, Helen, etc.). It was launched from the parent aircraft in the air and flown by a suicide pilot. The BAKA bomb was 20 ft long, and had wingspan of 16 feet, and weighed 4200 lbs. Construction was of aluminum, plywood, or other types of light wood. The bomb was attached to the plane by a single shackle located forward of the cockpit; it could also be carried and launched at night by a radar-equipped mother plane. Speed average was estimated to be about 400 to 450 miles an hour at level flight. The warhead was made so as to carry 2000 lbs. of explosives. Okinawa, 1945. *Meaning fool or idiot, in Japanese.

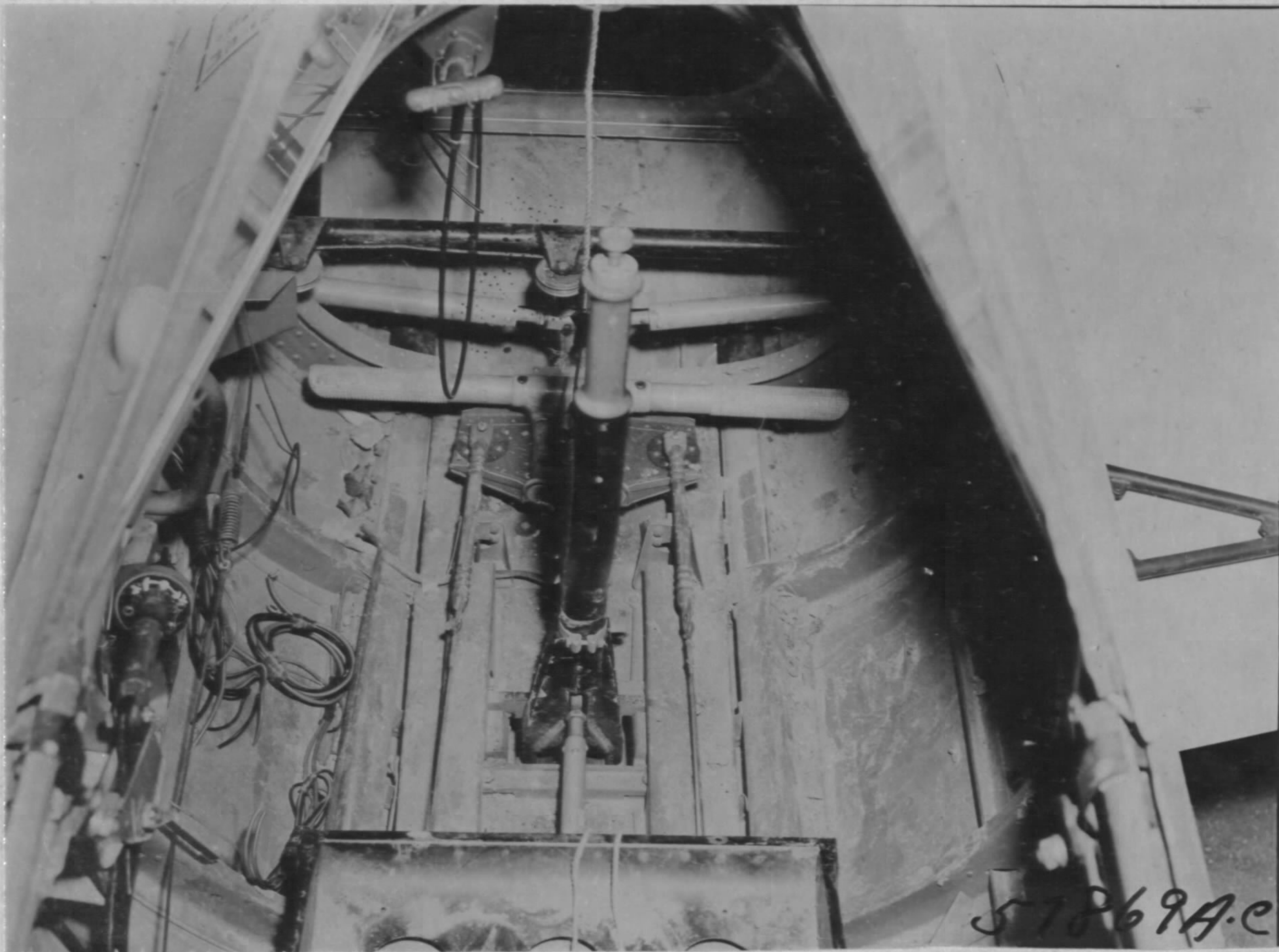





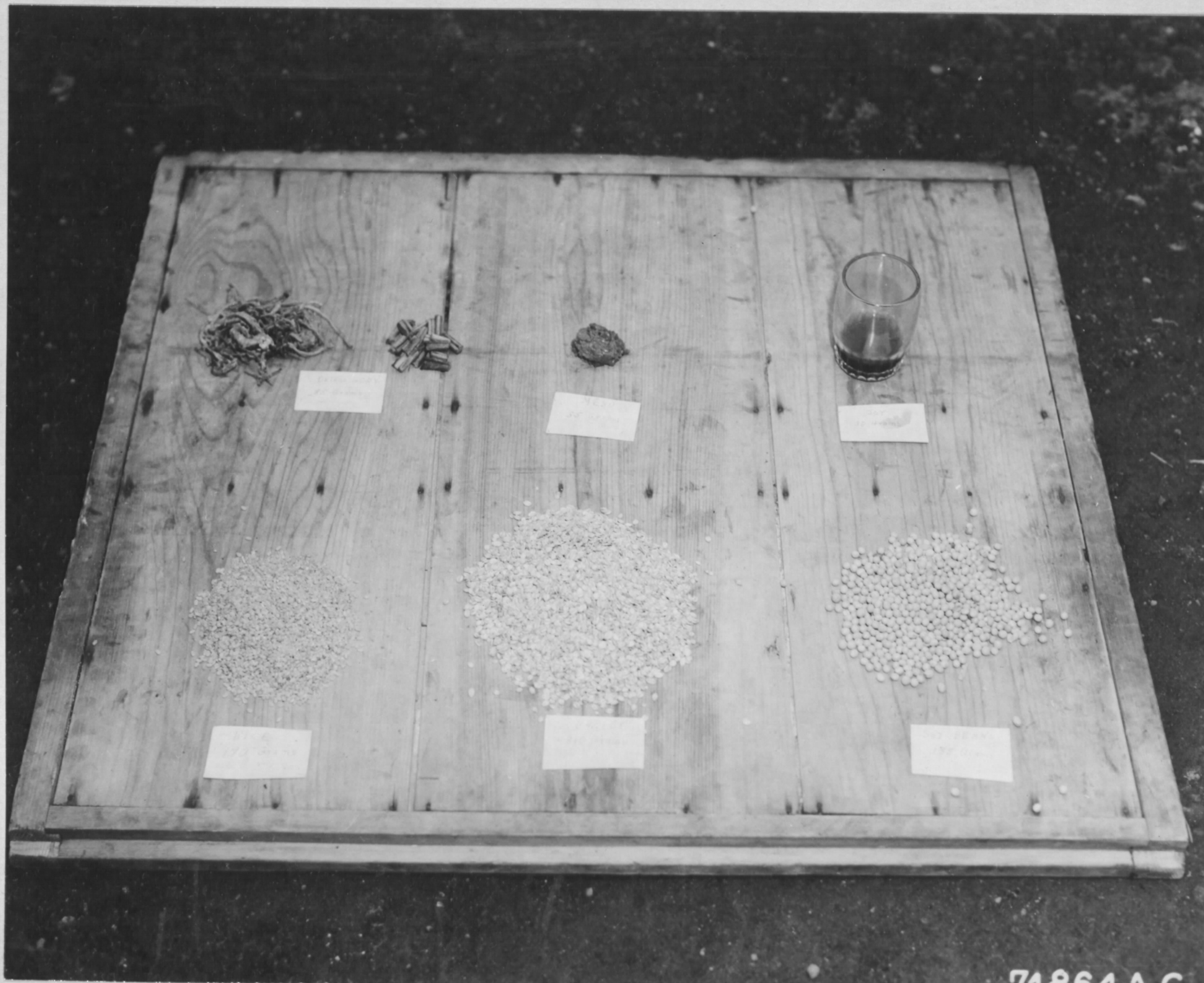
