I have the honor to discuss the Japanese North China Garrison, with especial reference to its numerical strength and to the views of its officers with regard to Sino-Japanese relations.


The names, positions, and alignment of a few of the officers, as known to the Embassy, may not be without interest. The better known of the "rabid" officers are those three who allegedly direct the affairs of the East Hopei Anti-communist Autonomous Government; namely, Major Sadao Senda, in charge of the East Hopei affairs section of the headquarters of the North China Garrison, Lieut. Col. Shigeru Hosoki, Chief of the Special Military Organ at T'ungchow, the capital of the bogus regime, and Lieut. Col. Jun Yokoyama, Chief of the Special Military Organ at Shanhaikwan. Another is Lieut. Col. Takaji Wachi, a staff officer of the North China Garrison.

That division of opinion among these officers is more complicated than is indicated by the broad description "immoderates" and "moderates" may be ascertained from reference to them by Japanese nationals as such-and-such an officer's "man". One may be referred to as an Ishihara man, that is, in sympathy with the views of Major Gen. Kenji Ishihara of the Tokyo General Staff; another may be referred to as an Itagaki man, that is, in sympathy with views of Lieut. Gen. Seishiro Itagaki, former Chief of Staff of the Kwantung Army; another as an Isogai man, views of Major Gen. Rensuke Isogai, former Military Attache to China; and another as an Imai man, that is, views of Lieut. Gen. Kiyonori Imai, Vice Chief of the Tokyo General Staff. An example of this sort of division is found in statements of Japanese to the effect that military and assistant military attaches in China are all Isogai men. These attaches are not, of course, attached to the North China Garrison, but the example is nevertheless believed to be pertinent.

KAWAMOTO Yoshitaro supervised WACHI's RAN KIKAN in the Shanghai area, an organization set up for the purpose of subverting Chinese for use by the Japanese. A classmate of both Major General YAMAMOTO (fnu), head of the KIKU KIKAN, and Major General KAGESA Sadaaki.

Major General, Japanese Army, Infantry, at the time of his leadership of the RAN KIKAN (1938-1942). He was later elevated to Lieutenant General and served from 1942 onward primarily in military commands. WACHI had had many years in China, and was quite fluent in the Chinese language, and claimed to be on good terms with many high-ranking Chungking figures in the Chinese Nationalist regime. For these reasons, not because of any intelligence experience, he was ordered in 1938 to form the RAN (Orchid) KIKAN, with the objective of secret political operations to subvert the Chungking government and simultaneously to procure military information concerning Chungking. When WACHI had been in Kwangsi much earlier, he had formed a close connection with LI Tsung-jen and PAI Chung-hsi, leaders of the later "Kwangsi Clique". His prime operations were aimed at subversion and defection of these individuals, which he claimed would only be a matter of time. WACHI often boasted that their friendship and loyalty toward him was very great, and LI and PAI apparently played along with him a bit. Actually, source ( ) indicates that the general consensus of opinion was that the two Chinese leaders, who had a very influential and almost autonomous position in South China, really disliked WACHI intensely even though he did not realize it. In any event, he never succeeded in defecting them.

WACHI'S RAN KIKAN, in contrast to the UME KIKAN, produced very few reports, and although WACHI is not believed to have been dishonest, he was considered in the Shanghai area to be completely unfit for intelligence work. The RAN KIKAN remained small throughout its rather non-productive history. WACHI was a classmate of KAGESA at Army Officers' School, and their personal relations were always good except for occasional professional entanglements. Source met WACHI occasionally during his Shanghai tour of duty and was and is on good terms with him. Source likes WACHI but does not think much of his ability. Source first met WACHI in a professional capacity about the end of 1939. Source had rounded up a number of clandestine radio operators in the Shanghai area who had been under suspicion for some time, jailed them, and prepared to interrogate them. Several days later, WACHI phoned him, even though Source's office was a stone's throw from WACHI's and indicated quite insecurely on the telephone that several of the jailed radio operators belonged to the RAN KIKAN. Source quickly visited WACHI and WACHI could not describe nor name the operators. He did not know which officer in his unit was running those radiomen, so, with Source still present, he called in all his unit officers to find out which officer was running what radio operators! Later, when WACHI moved off into the Hankow area, as he did several times, he set up a large sign at his billet in Hangkow reading "WACHI BUTAI HQ"; visitors entering saw the eminent major general and one enlisted clerk! Most of WACHI's few subordinates were civilians, some of whom were reputed to be quite able.

As the above anecdotes illustrate, WACHI was a very insecure person for intelligence work, and apparently had few clear ideas of exactly what he was after. He frequently became very enthusiastic about a project advanced by a subordinate, approved it, and then forgot completely what it was or why he had wanted it. As a result, WACHI's projects were often very numerous, but few of them ever were followed through to

logical and successful conclusion. His thinking was rapid, enthusiastic, and large-scale, but he could never wait for results and hardly recognized common ordinary intelligence information as a worthwhile result - BIG things had to happen, and QUICKLY to suit him. The few successes achieved on a working level by the RAN KIKAN were primarily due to subordinates and in spite of WACHI. Nevertheless, WACHI was highly thought of by Imperial GHQ. He operated far and wide with very little assistance, but if he had achieved any successes, all of Shanghai and Nanking would have heard about it from him, so it is very doubtful if he did not get very far in his political objectives. (ZJL-604, 19 Apr 51, [ ] CE File III-33).

Together with SATOMI Ryosaku and BABA Yusuke, KURIHARA Sho has now strengthened connections with the famous Rightist philosopher, OKAWA Shumei, and to the central figures affiliated with the GENYOSHA: TANAKA Shinichi, WACHI Takaji and KOBAYASHI Shosaburo... Many of SATOMI's private connections are not clearly discernible even now, but the following definite relationships can be reported: OIKAWA Genshichi, AKIGUSA Toshi, Lt General WACHI Takaji, SAKURABA Shiro, etc. (ZJL-621, 18 May 51, [ ] CE File III-36.2)

The JONAN Group contains former politicians like BABA Yusuke and TAKASE Den with connections to OKAWA Shumei and HATOYAMA Ichiro; former diplomats KURIHARA Sho, TSUCHIDA Yutaka, and KAWAI Tatsu; ex-Army leaders TANAKA Shinichi, OBA @ SAKURABA Shiro, and, lately, OIKAWA Genshichi; former Navy leaders MAEDA Minoru, KOBAYASHI Shosaburo, KAWAHARA Yoshiro, and Admiral YAMAMOTO's son-in-law, Captain FUKUSHIMA, in addition to officials in the MSA who are former Navy men; former I.S. and TOKUNU KIKAN figures like NISHIHARA Masao, Deputy G-2, Kwantung Army, and WACHI Takaji of RAN KIKAN; last but hardly least, it includes SATOMI Ryosaku @ Hajime, onetime associate of KODAMA Yoshio's in China and supporter of the Army Intelligence Units in China by virtue of his vast economic operations, legal or otherwise - a shadowy "friend" of the great in every field.

If the present alignment of the JONAN Group is maintained and friendly relations with KAWABE Torashiro and his subordinates continue, inclusion of Assistant Kwantung Army G-2 NISHIHARA, SAKURABA Shiro, and WACHI Takaji on top subordinate levels in the Army Intelligence section will probably result. (ZJL#1473, 11 May 1951; CE File III-1)

1. The Kanto Restoration Movement Council (Kanto Bunko Kyogikai), an organization which combines rightist groups in the Kanto area, includes the following former army and navy officers among its members:

HARAI Tadashi (33-7/125/1973) - former lieutenant general<sup>12</sup>  
 IMAI Junzo (4470/5579, 13-1/5005) - former army captain  
 KOBAYASHI Kazuhiko (1-35/2631/1-35/5005/5005) - former vice admiral<sup>13</sup>  
 KUBAKI Eisaku (4-76/1-35/5005/1945) - former rear admiral<sup>14</sup>  
 SAKURA Shunichi (344/1-35/1-35/5005) - former lieutenant general<sup>15</sup>  
 WAKIYAMA Shunichi (0735/1-35/774/5005) - former lieutenant general<sup>16</sup>  
 MATSUME Matsuo (1234/6704/1234) - former lieutenant general<sup>17</sup>

2. The above-named individuals were formerly associated with the Imperial Way Party (Kodo Ka). They strongly favor rearmament on the theory that the national policy should be based on rearmament, and they are extremely critical of the present Government's program of gradual rearmament.

3. Field Comment. According to another Japanese Government document, the Kanto Bunko Kyogikai in Kanto District, which is roughly equivalent to the Tokyo-Yokohama area, was founded 28 July 1953 in Tokyo, and is headed by MIYAKI Taku (0004/0004/0987) of "9-15" Incident fame.

Washington Comment. According to Kyodo, Tokyo, 28 July 1953, some 200 members of various nationalist bodies in Japan met 27 July 1953 in an effort toward the formation of a united front in Japan, and decided to set up a "Kanto district council for a restoration movement." Representatives came from the seven Kanto prefectures centering around Tokyo, and the three adjoining prefectures of Kanagawa, Maebashi, and Niigata. Among them were such leading rightist leaders as IMAI Junzo, MIYAKI Taku, and SAKURA Shunichi. The council elected its delegates to the proposed preparatory committee for establishment of a national organization for a "national salvation" movement.

On 22 September 1953 Kyodo reported that the preparatory committee of the National Salvation Movement Council met on that date in Osaka to prepare for the amalgamation of leading ultranationalist groups in Japan, which meeting was attended by INOUE Hisaho, OKADA Shumei, MURAKI Kenichiro, MIKI Taku, and SAGAYA (sic) Tameo from the Kanto District. The policy of the Council, according to Kyodo, is anti-Constitution, pro-self defense, pre-establishment of a peaceful Asian co-prosperity sphere. At the meeting, the preparatory committee released a statement stressing that "for attainment of the Fatherland's complete independence, there will be no alternative but to organize unification of our national salvation common fronts." According to Kyodo, the inaugural meeting of the Council is to be held in the spring of 1954.

On 2 October 1953 Tokyo Nichinichi announced that the National Salvation Movement Council had appointed five councillors: WACHI Takaji, WATANABE Wataru, TANAKA Shinichi, HAMAYA Tadashi (all former lieutenant generals) and KOBAYASHI Shomeburo (former admiral).

#### Field Comments

2. HAMAYA was stationed in China during the war, and has been active in the Sakura Kai (see SO-89912).
3. KOBAYASHI was at one time Vice Minister of the Navy; he has been reported as one of Prime Minister YOSHIDA's top advisors on naval affairs, and as connected with rightist activities.
4. MIYAZAKI was an unsuccessful candidate for the House of Representatives in the April 1953 elections.
5. TANAKA was Chief of Staff of the Japanese Forces in Burma at the end of World War II. His advocacy of rearmament was reported in SC-81631, and other activities in connection with the Iahin Undo Kyogikai in CS-25684.
6. WACHI has been extremely active in rightist circles, particularly those of a pan-Asian nature.
7. WATANABE, a member of the Continental Problems Research Institute (Tairiku Mondai Kenkyusho) of DOI Akio, is known as a promoter of rearmament.
8. The Kodo Ka was not a formal organization, but one of the grand divisions of Japanese rightists in pre-war days, standing for the purely nationalist faction, as opposed to the national socialist (fascist) or pan-Asian factions. It would appear that WACHI, for one, was more in the last-named group than in the Kodo Ka.

1. About 20 August 1953 HO I-chih (0149/6654/0037), formerly known as HUIA Wen-yun (1115/2429/6663), received a letter addressed to him in care of the Setts Company, Fourth Floor, Marunouchi Building, 1-chome, Marunouchi, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo, from LI Tsung-jen (2521/1350/0068). The main points of the letter were that CHIAO Kai-shek had already lost the China mainland and the support of the overseas Chinese, that the problems of finance could be solved, that if and when an attack on the mainland were made, Japan would be the military springboard, that the matters discussed in the letter should be kept secret, and that HO should exert all his efforts to cultivate the Japanese and the overseas Chinese and to establish good relationships in anticipation of the time when LI would have an opportunity to visit Japan.

2. HO, a native of Manchuria, over fifty years of age, served as chief of the Shensi Provincial Police Department and also as chief of the Shensi Provincial Construction Department during the MANG Chiang-wei regime. During the latter part of the Sino-Japanese War HO acted as the representative of a staff officer, Lt. General MACHI Takagatsu, at the Japanese General Headquarters in Nanking. This was the time when LI Tsung-jen, because of military reverses in Kwangsi, began surrender negotiations with the Japanese in order to save his troops. The numerous conditions laid down by LI and the Japanese resulted in lengthy negotiations which were never concluded because the war ended. Both LI and HO kept silent so that the details of LI's surrender negotiations remained a secret. Because of the fact HO has knowledge of the negotiations, LI has treated HO as a good friend.

3. After HO became a resident of Japan, he was entirely dependent upon CH'ANG I-min (1603/1355/3046), for his livelihood. CH'ANG was formerly known as HUI Ching-ho (1776/2529/0137). In August 1953, he was head of the Setts Company. During the MANG Chiang-wei regime CH'ANG served as Director of the Shensi Provincial Consolidated Tax Bureau. Later he became Inspector-General, with the rank of Brigadier General, of the Rear Service Bureau of the MANG Chiang-wei armed forces. In 1949 he went to Japan by way of Hong Kong. He became involved in smuggling goods to the mainland. His main

ging activities were temporarily stopped when his Japanese crew members became involved in a drunken brawl at Honolulu Pier, Hawaii, and attracted the attention of the police. The active shipment of goods, valued at more than \$50,000,000 (above U.S. \$100,000), was obtained. After several court actions, the Japanese Government confiscated the goods.

1. **Washington Comment:** DO I-chih (also known as HUIA Hsu-yun) has been variously reported as a Chinese Communist Party agent directing Communist activities in Japan (in 1950) and as a Chinese Third Force leader working in Japan to promote Li Tsung-shan's political activities (in September 1951). DO has also been reported to be a Japanese-trained war-time collaborator. He is said to have arrived in Japan in 1931 by means of a smuggling operation.

2. **Field Comment:** According to available information, the Sella Company, also known as the Sella Tung Company, was in late 1951 a firm serving as headquarters in Japan for Communist smuggling and intelligence activities.

3. **Field Comment:** According to available information, in 1952 the Sella Company was a Chinese trading company allegedly used for shipping between Chinese and Communist China. It reportedly had been organized by a Third Force group under Li Tsung-shan, with operations conducted from a Tokyo office.

3. **Field Comment:** Another report has stated that Li Tsung-shan protected DO because HUIA was a close relative.

4. **Field Comment:** A usually reliable source reported that in late 1951 DO I-chih was a representative in Japan of the Chinese Communist Party's Social Affairs Department.

5. **Field Comment:** According to previous information from the same source, DO was a living by writing.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Deputy Director of Central Intelligence

SUBJECT: General T. WACHI

In response to the letter dated 11 April 1955, addressed to you, FE Division submits the following information:

1. T. WACHI is believed identical with WACHI Takaji, former Lt. General, who is extremely active in rightist circles, particularly those of a Pan-Asian nature. There is no information to indicate that he is "head of a powerful anti-Communist organization in Japan with a membership of six millions". The most recent information indicates he is a Councillor in the "Rente Restoration Movement Council", an organization which combines rightist groups in the Kanto area in Japan. The "Rente Restoration Movement Council" was formed in July 1953. WACHI is also a Councillor of the National Salvation Movement Council, whose policy is anti-Constitution, pro-self defense and pro-establishment of a peaceful Asia co-prosperity sphere. The latter information is dated 1 June 1954. A report dated 24 September 1951, from a fairly reliable source, indicated that WACHI Takaji was one of the Japanese advisors to the Sino-Japanese Cultural and Economic Association which was recently organized in Hong Kong.

2. WACHI had had intelligence experience, but reportedly was not a particularly successful operator. A report dated 19 April 1951, evaluation unknown, reflected that WACHI Takaji was a former Major General and served many years in China. He was reported to be quite fluent in the Chinese language and claimed to be on good terms with many high-ranking Chungking figures of the Chinese Nationalist regime. For these reasons and not because of any intelligence experience, in 1938 he was ordered to form the RAN KIKAS with the objective of conducting secret political operations to subvert the Chungking Government and simultaneously, to procure

military information/

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military information concerning the "Ganghwa".

2. It is reported that WARTI prior to 1936 in Pusan province, had formed a close association with one LI Tsung-jen, a key figure dated August 1953, from a source of unknown reliability, PRC/SCS dated during the latter part of the China-Japanese War, and WARTI (0000/650/2-37) acted as a representative of LI, Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek in the Pusan negotiations with LI Tsung-jen. It is noted at this time that LI Tsung-jen, because of military reverses in Manchuria, began surrender negotiations with the Japanese in order to save his troops. The numerous consultations held down by LI and the Japanese resulted in lengthy negotiations which were never concluded because the war ended. Both LI and ID kept silent as to the details of LI's surrender negotiations have remained a secret.

3. A report from the FBI dated 11 October 1954, indicates that one Mr. FRI (PO) whom the American business may be identified with the ID Tachibana mentioned above, and who is a representative of a Japanese firm, General WARTI, was scheduled to come to the United States to discuss with LI Tsung-jen the possible amalgamation of the Pan Pacific Alliance Council with anti-Communist organizations being coordinated by LI Tsung-jen. The status of the information received is noted in the Pan Pacific Alliance Council.

4. ID Tachibana has been variously reported as a Chinese Communist spy agent directing Communist activities in Japan in 1950 and as a Chinese Third Force leader working in Japan to promote LI Tsung-jen's political activities. He has also been reported as a close relative of LI Tsung-jen. ID is said to have arrived in Japan in 1951 by means of a smuggling operation.

5. It is important to note that since late 1954, the FBI has been collecting information on LI Tsung-jen and third force elements here, by the Department of Justice. General WARTI's apparent interest and affiliation with LI Tsung-jen has been pointed out to the FBI by the FBI Division in previous correspondence.

The FBI Division believes from a cursory examination of these facts, that "any participation in this or similar would be the absolute of this time in that there appears considerable political motivation on the part of WARTI and LI and a wide range of other company in the available facts surrounding this anti-Communist organization.

1. KARYUWA explained that he had called this meeting to pass on to us some operational proposals originated by OGATA Shunroku, (born 24 June 1899). He said that OGATA had sent letters, containing these proposals, starting from Nagao to a businessman in Japan named YACHI Takaji (0735/4249/7751) (b. 2 January 1893 in Hiroshima-ken, Japan) with instructions to pass them to the appropriate U.S. Government element. YACHI gave them to MINAMI KARYUWA, who is a personal friend of KARYUWA's. KARYUWA told YACHI he would pass them to the Americans.

2. ~~Attache's~~ Attachment "A" to this ~~background~~ contact report is ~~background~~ background information on GUA, who now lives in Macao, as well as his proposal for anti-Communist ~~guerrilla~~ guerrilla operations using the Macao border as southern China and adjacent areas. This proposal was originally embodied in a letter from GUA to ~~WACH~~ WACH. Attachments "B" and "C" are ~~WACH~~ translations of letters from GUA to WACH describing his proposal for establishing a narcotics ring in Macao. The attachments are self-explanatory.

3. ~~MARUYAMA~~ said we can contact him directly if we wish. He said he has no objection to our contacting CG TA directly in Hanoi if we wish. As to WACHU, MARUYAMA said we can contact him directly if we choose or MARUYAMA will deal with him in our behalf, if we so desire. The only thing MARUYAMA wants from us in this case is our evaluation of the proposals. TOUCHSTONE promised him this, pointing out that we may have to wait until we have consulted our people in Hong Kong.

4. T. KAWABATA asked if KAWAYAMA thinks there is any "flap potential" in the fact that OGURA knows that these proposals (which would make good newspaper stories) KAWABATA are being passed to the Americans. He said he knows WACHI well and has confidence that he will be discreet.

5. Herman AREYANA also passed us a photo of OGAFA seated with high-level officials.

U. (Note: Station files show OGATA as a WWII Japanese intelligence operator in China. In 1954 he ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ sent a letter to the Japanese consulate in Hong Kong, addressed to Japanese Foreign Minister OKAZAKI. 1. Reference is made to the request dated 1 August 1962, subject as above, whose name you desired checked against the files of this office. The files contain the following information concerning an individual who is probably identifiable with the subject of the request.

2. According to a report dated 28 April 1961, received through an ( ), the source stated that he had been informed in 1959 by a personal friend, one WACHI Takaji, formerly a Lieutenant General in the Japanese Army, that OGATA Shunsaku (1442/1748/0193/0155), a suspected information broker, was in a position to help the Japanese Government and the United States military authorities in the Far East smash a narcotics ring, sponsored by the Chinese Communists, which had bases in Hong Kong and Macao.

3. According to a report dated 13 January 1955, received from a usually reliable source, WACHI Takaji, a former Lieutenant General, was identified as a member of the Ajia Konwa Kai (0068/4798/0068/2017/6114/2585) (Asian Affairs Discussion Society) located in the Saiwai Building, Uchi Saiwai-cho, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo. This organization contained a number of former military and naval personnel and individuals with intelligence experience; however, nothing was known at the time concerning the organization's supporters or its intelligence activities. WACHI was described as having had intelligence experience, and he was considered a specialist on China.

4. According to a report dated 7 March 1952, received from a fairly reliable source, one Colonel WACHI Takaji (0735/2535/7751/0059) was involved with the DOIHARA Kikan Operations Unit

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in Shanghai circa June 1938 to about April 1939 and he was delegated the responsibility of bringing the Kwangsi Army over to the Japanese side. The DOIHARA Operation was a morale operation aimed at resolving the Chinese war by the establishment of a new central government in China around one T'ANG Shao-i who was subsequently assassinated in September 1938 allegedly by "agents of CHIANG."

5. Information contained in a report dated 24 October 1952, received from a usually reliable source, content evaluation "possibly true", indicated that former Lieutenant General WACHI Takaji was a member of the Japan-China Collaborative Society which was basically a "rightist" organization composed of Taiwanese who were opposed to CHIANG Kai-shek. WACHI was one of several leading Japanese figures who belonged to the society. Its ideology was described as being anti-Kuomintang; anti-United States, and somewhat favorable to Communist China.

6. According to a report dated 5 December 1952, received from a usually reliable source, one WACHI Takaji (0735/2535/7751/0059) attended a meeting on 20 October 1952, of the Patriotic Youth Volunteer Committee (Aikoku Seinen Yushi Iinkai). The Patriotic Youth Volunteer Committee was, at the writing of the report, anti-Communist and stressed the necessity for rearmament.

7. According to a report dated 19 December 1952, received from a usually reliable source, WACHI Takaji (0735/0966/7751/0059), was a backer of a "rightist" society called Akebono-no-Sha with headquarters at Tokyo-to, Chiyoda-ku, Kanda Jimbo-cho, 1-16. This society of former army officers was founded in May 1952 with the objectives of opposing Communism, promoting rearmament, and security aid for disabled veterans. It had a capital of \$800,000 and published a monthly magazine, Akebono, in about 4,000 copies. WACHI was described as a former Lieutenant General and as a graduate of the 26th class of the Japanese War College.

8. According to a report dated 19 April 1951, received from a source whose reliability cannot be judged, content evaluation "possibly true", WACHI Takaji was a Major General, Japanese Army, Infantry, at the time of his leadership of the RAN (Orchid) Kikan (1938-1942). He was later elevated to the rank of Lieutenant General and served from 1942 onward primarily in military commands. WACHI had served many years in China, was quite fluent in the Chinese language, and claimed to be on good terms with many high-ranking Chungking figures in the Chinese Nationalist regime. For these reasons, not by reason of any intelligence experience, he was ordered in 1938 to form the RAN Kikan, with the objective of secret political operations to subvert the Chungking Government and simultaneously to procure mili-

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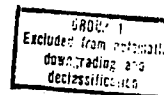
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tary information concerning Chungking. When WACHI had been in Kwangsi much earlier, he had formed a close association with LI Tsung-jen and PAI Chung-hsi, leaders of the later "Kwangsi Clique". His prime operations were aimed at subversion and defection of these individuals, which he claimed would be only a matter of time. WACHI often boasted that their friendship and loyalty toward him was very great, and LI and PAI apparently played along with him. Actually, the source indicated that the general consensus of opinion was that the two Chinese leaders, who had a very influential and almost autonomous position in South China, really disliked WACHI intensely even though he did not realize it. In any event, he never succeeded in defecting them. Source had the following to say in regard to WACHI's ability:

a. WACHI's RAN Kikan, in contrast to the UME Kikan, produced very few reports, and although WACHI was not believed to have been dishonest, he was considered in the Shanghai area to be completely unfit for intelligence work. The RAN Kikan remained small throughout its rather non-productive history. Source met WACHI occasionally during Source's Shanghai tour of duty and was (at the date of this report) on good terms with him. Source further added that he liked WACHI personally but did not think much of his ability. The source first met WACHI in a professional capacity about the end of 1939. Source had rounded up a number of clandestine radio operators in the Shanghai area who had been under suspicion for some time, jailed them, and prepared to interrogate them. Several days later, WACHI phoned him, even though Source's office was a stone's throw away from WACHI's and indicated quite insecurely on the telephone that several of the jailed radio operators belonged to the RAN Kikan. Source quickly visited WACHI and WACHI could not describe nor name the operators. WACHI did not know which officer in his unit was running those radiomen, so, with Source still present, he called in all his unit officers to find out which officer was running what radio operators. Later, when WACHI moved to the Hankow area, as he did several times, he set up a large sign at his billet in Hankow reading "WACHI Butai HQ", and visitors entering saw the eminent Major General and one enlisted clerk. Most of WACHI's few subordinates were civilians, some of whom were reputed to be quite able.

b. According to Source, as the above illustrates, WACHI was a very insecure person for intelligence work, and he apparently had few clear ideas of exactly what he was after. He frequently became very enthusiastic about a project advanced by a subordinate, approved it, and then

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forgot completely what it was or why he had wanted it. As a result, WACHI's projects were often very numerous, but few of them ever were followed through to a logical and successful conclusion. His thinking was rapid, enthusiastic, and large-scale, but he could never wait for results and hardly recognized common ordinary intelligence information as a worthwhile result. According to Source, big things had to happen, and quickly to suit WACHI. The few successes achieved on a working level by the HAN Kikan were primarily due to subordinates and in spite of WACHI. Nevertheless, WACHI was highly thought of by Imperial General Headquarters. Source further indicated that WACHI operated far and wide with very little assistance, but if he had achieved any successes, all of Shanghai and Nanking would have heard about it from him, so it is very doubtful if he did get very far in his political objectives.

Comment: The source of the above mentioned report might possibly have been mistaken and have underrated the connection between WACHI and the Kwangsi Clique personalities, however it threw an interesting light on the intentions of the JONAN Group which was a rather extensive group of former Japanese Intelligence Service officers, militarists, and conservative political leaders, whose aims were to form "a syndicate with far reaching influence and well-laid plans for reassertion of Japanese militarist-nationalism in every phase of the nation's life." WACHI was a secret member of the JONAN Group which had plans of working closely with the Chinese Third Force.

9. Information contained in a report dated 28 August 1951, received from a usually reliable source, indicated that Lieutenant General WACHI Takaji and other former members of the secret sections of the JONAN-Genyosha Group were being asked by one SATOMI Hajime to discontinue contacts with the JONAN office even by phone until the future status of the organization could be either determined or terminated. SATOMI became upset in early June 1951 at the failure of the JONAN Company to provide adequate funds and with FURUYA Tatsuo's (who was president of the JONAN Company) personal ambitions that he threatened to abandon the enterprise completely and engage in his own clandestine organizations and operations exclusively.

10. Information contained in a report dated 16 November 1951, received from a fairly reliable source, indicated that former Lieutenant General WACHI Takaji (0735/4249/7751/0059) was a Japanese adviser of the Sino-Japanese Cultural and Economic Association which was organized in Hong Kong and supported by the American Consulate there.

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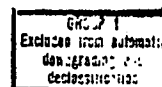
11. According to a report dated 30 April 1946, received from a predecessor organization which evaluated the source as fairly reliable and the content evaluation as "possibly true", one WACHI Takaji, a staff officer of the Tientsin Garrison Headquarters travelled with one Colonel SHIGEWAKA to Peking on 9 July 1937, to effect an armistice with the Chinese. He returned to Tientsin two days later when no accord had been reached with the Chinese.

12. According to an article which appeared in 9 October 1953, edition of the Japanese newspaper YOMIURI SHIMBUN, former Lieutenant General WACHI (fnu), who is probably identifiable with the subject of the request, belonged to an organization called the Special Intelligence Group. This group operated within the Japanese General Staff Headquarters as the Special Intelligence Section and was formerly divided into various squads known respectively as the Soviet, American, British, German and French squads. They specialized in monitoring wireless transmissions and deciphering coded messages intercepted from their respective spheres. This group comprised an organization that was associated with the special military organs, and WACHI's group was known as the RAN Kikan. The article indicated that the members of this group had origins and functions which remained undisclosed, in brief, they remained in the background.

13. Information contained in a report dated 13 February 1951, received from a usually reliable source, indicated that one Lieutenant General WAJI (or WACHI) (fnu), who is probably identifiable with the subject of the request, was reputed to be a top-notch intelligence officer with considerable experience and training and was a former close associate of both SATOMI Hajime and former Kwantung Army G-2 Lieutenant General YANAGIDA. He entered the Jonan Peace and Independence Committee group at the request of SATOMI, and worked closely with one SAKURABA Shiro who was listed overtly as the Managing Director of the JONAN Company and KAWAMOTO Yoshishiro who was connected with the secret section of the JONAN Company. WACHI was interested chiefly in the recruitment of former Harbin Intelligence School graduates to use them as a nucleus for a future Japan Intelligence Service. Most of WACHI's experience was overseas, and he had a low opinion of the NAKANO School in comparison to the Harbin School. Source further reported on 11 April 1951, that Lieutenant General WACHI was a senior advisor in the Japanese Army Intelligence Revival Section of the JONAN Group.

Comment: There was a listing in the Army Officers Roster, 1943 for WACHI Takaji, Major General (date of rank, March 1940), Infantry. His assignment as of February 1942 was Chief of Staff, 14th Army. At this post,

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one Lieutenant General UTSUNOMIYA (fnu), who was (in 1951) an employee of the Geographical and Historical Section, G-2, GHQ, was one of his staff officers.

14. According to a report dated 29 March 1951, received from the same usually reliable source as in paragraph 13 above, Lieutenant General WACHI (fnu), a member of the Jonan group, and several other former Japanese Army and Navy leaders and other individuals connected with the National Rural Police Director-General attended a secret conference held at "OMORI TEI" (OMORI Chop House) Omori on 27 February 1951. Source stated that the details of this meeting were not known, but it was described as "top secret". The same type of meeting was to be held once a month from that time on.

15. According to a report dated 4 June 1946, received from a predecessor organization, Lieutenant General WACHI (fnu), was a prominent radical who held an intelligence post in the China Expeditionary Forces (CEF). WACHI served as right-hand man to one General MAZAKI and in 1933, when WACHI held the rank of Colonel, he became Chief of the Dai Ni Ka and had as his assistant one Colonel TSUJI. In 1939 WACHI, after promotion to Major General, and TSUJI were removed to the front at Hankow. At the end of the war WACHI was Assistant Chief of Staff of Nambosogun (Southern Forces). The policy which WACHI and TSUJI endeavored to enforce was complete military domination of China and the dividing of China into two states, the North China Provisional Government and the Taido Puppet Regime. They strongly opposed the formation of the Wong Ching Wei Puppet Government. As a result of the insubordinate activity by these individuals, TOJO sent one HARUKE (fnu) and one SAKATA (fnu) in 1939 as supervisors to the Headquarters, CEF, but they were gradually influenced by the radicals and became involved in exploitation and fortune seeking rackets. However, by 1943 TOJO had managed to eliminate most of the radical staff officers from CEF Headquarters, usually by sending them off to the front.

16. For additional information concerning WACHI Takaji, you are referred to the Department of the Army, Headquarters, Fourth District, 441st Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment.

17. You are also referred to CS-25685, dated 30 November 1953, subject: Restoration Movement Council in Kanto District; and CS-43517, dated 30 July 1954, subject: Relationship between LI Tsung-jen and HO I-chih.

18. [redacted] has no record of a current operational interest in Subject.
